SYNOPSIS

Provides for procurement by State of pharmacy benefits manager, automated reverse auction services, and claims adjudication services.

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AN ACT providing for the procurement by the State of a pharmacy
 benefits manager, automated reverse auction services, and claims
 adjudication services.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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8 1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the 9 contrary, a contract for the services of a Pharmacy Benefits 10 Manager (PBM) for the State Health Benefits Plan (SHBP) and the 11 School Employees' Health Benefits Plan (SEHBP) shall be 12 procured in an expedited process and in the manner provided by this 13 section.

14 The Division of Purchase and Property in the Department of the 15 Treasury shall conduct a reverse auction for pharmacy benefit 16 manager services. In order to optimize potential savings to the 17 State and expedite compliance with the May 11, 2018 order of the 18 New Jersey Superior Court, Appellate Division, in In re Request for 19 Proposals ##17DPP00144, 454 N.J. Super. 527 (App. Div. 2018), 20 the reverse auction process and award of a contract to a PBM shall 21 be completed by January 15, 2019.

22 b. The division shall procure the technology platform required 23 for conduct of the reverse auction and related professional services 24 either by extension of a contract in effect on the effective date of 25 P.L. (pending before the Legislature as this bill), or, , c. 26 alternatively, through the expedited process as provided herein no 27 later than November 1, 2018. The contract for such services shall not be awarded to a vendor that is a PBM, is a subsidiary or affiliate 28 29 of a PBM, is managed by a PBM, or receives remuneration from a 30 PBM for aggregating clients into a contractual relationship with a 31 PBM. The vendor may not outsource any part of the reverse auction 32 or the automated, real-time, electronic, line-by-line, claim-by-claim 33 review of invoiced PBM prescription drug claims.

c. Except as otherwise provided in subsection b. of this section,
the division shall procure, without the need for formal
advertisement, but through the solicitation of proposals from
professional services vendors, from qualified vendors the following
services based upon price and other factors:

(1) technical assistance to the State to evaluate the qualifications
of bidders on a PBM procurement, to provide online automated
reverse auction services to support the Department of the Treasury
in comparing the pricing for the PBM procurement, and to perform
related professional services.

44 The technology platform shall, at a minimum, possess the ability45 to:

46 conduct an automated, online, reverse auction of PBM services;

automate re-pricing of PBM proposals for the SHBP and SEHBP
prescription drug spending using 100 percent of annual SHBP and

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SEHBP prescription drug claims data and utilizing code-based
 classification of drugs from nationally-accepted data sources for
 comparisons of the costs of PBM proposals;

produce an automated report and analysis of PBM bids,
including the ranking of bids, based on the comparative costs and
qualitative aspects thereof, within a 48-hour time period following
close of each round of reverse auction bidding; and

8 perform real-time, electronic, line-by-line, claim-by-claim 9 review of invoiced PBM prescription drug claims using an 10 automated claims adjudication technology platform that allows for 11 online comparison of PBM invoices and auditing of other aspects of 12 the services provided by the PBM; and

13 (2) a PBM and related services.

d. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the
contrary, for the purpose of expediting the procurements, the
following provisions shall apply as modifications to law or
regulation that may interfere with the expedited award of the above
services:

(1) the timeframes for challenging the specifications shall bemodified as determined by the division;

(2) in lieu of advertising in accordance with sections 2, 3, and 4
of P.L.1954, c.48 (C.52:34-7, C.52:34-8, and C.52:34-9), the
division shall advertise the request for proposals for the above
services and any addenda thereto on the division's website;

(3) the period of time that the State Comptroller has to review
the request for proposals for these professional services
procurements for compliance with applicable public contracting
laws, rules and regulations, pursuant to section 10 of P.L.2007, c.52
(C.52:15C-10), shall be 10 business days or less if practicable, as
determined by the State Comptroller;

(4) the timeframes for submission under section 4 of P.L.2012,
c.25 (C.52:32-58) and section 1 of P.L.1977, c.33 (C.52:25-24.2)
shall be extended to prior to the issuance of a Notice of Intent to
Award;

(5) the provisions of section 1 of P.L.2005, c.92 (C.52:34-13.2)
shall not apply to technical and support services, under this section,
provided by a vendor using a "24/7 follow-the-sun model" as long
as the contractor is able to provide such services in the United
States during the business day; and

40 (6) the term "bids" in subparagraph (f) of subsection a. of
41 section 7 of P.L.1954, c.48 (C.52:34-12) shall not include pricing
42 which will be revealed to all responsive bidders during the
43 negotiation process.

e. The division may, to the extent necessary, waive or modify
any other law or regulation that may interfere with the expeditious
procurement of these services.

47 f. For the purposes of this section:

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"Reverse auction" means an automated bidding process
 conducted online that starts with an opening price and allows
 qualified bidders to counter offer a lower price, for as many rounds
 of bidding as determined by the division.

5 "Price" means the projected cost of a PBM bid for providing 6 prescription drug benefits to the SHBP and SEHBP based on 7 automating re-pricing of PBM bids for purposes of comparison of 8 PBM proposal costs to the State over the duration of the contract.

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2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

15 This bill provides that the State will procure, in an expedited 16 manner, professional services contracts for: (1) technical assistance to 17 the State to evaluate the qualifications of bidders on a PBM procurement, to provide online automated reverse auction services to 18 19 support the Department of the Treasury in comparing the pricing for 20 the PBM procurement, and to perform related professional services, 21 the vendor for which may not be a PBM, be a subsidiary or affiliate of 22 a PBM, be managed by a PBM, or receive remuneration from a PBM 23 for aggregating clients into a contractual relationship with a PBM. The 24 vendor may not outsource any part of the reverse auction or the 25 automated, real-time, electronic, line-by-line, claim-by-claim review 26 of invoiced PBM prescription drug claims; and (2) a PBM for the State 27 Health Benefits Plan and the School Employees' Health Benefits Plan.

The reverse auction process and award of a contract to a PBM is to be completed by January 15, 2019.

The bill requires the Division of Purchase and Property to procure the technology platform required for the reverse auction and related services either by extension of a contract in effect on the effective date of the bill, or, alternatively, through the expedited process provided in the bill. If the division chooses to procure those services through the expedited process, the services must be procured by November 1, 2018.

The bill authorizes the Division of Purchase and Property in the Department of the Treasury, to the extent necessary, to waive or modify any other law or regulation that may interfere with the procurement of these services.

41 The New Jersey Superior Court, Appellate Division, decided the 42 matter of In re Request for Proposals ##17DPP00144, 454 N.J. 43 Super. 527 (App. Div. 2018) on May 11, 2018. In this case, the 44 court determined that the winning bid for the PBM contract 45 awarded in 2017 contained a substantial, material deviation from a 46 non-waivable term of the Solicitation for Bids, and thus, the court 47 ordered the PBM contract rebid as expeditiously as possible. 48 However, the court found no error in the conduct of the PBM

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reverse auction. The technology platform contracted by the State
and deployed to conduct the reverse auction strategy to create
dynamic competition for PBM services has produced unprecedented
prescription drug cost reductions for New Jersey taxpayers, State
and local governments, and public school districts.

Moreover, the automated, line-by-line, 100-percent-of-claims 6 7 electronic bill review conducted with the same technology platform 8 has identified tens of millions of dollars in PBM invoice 9 overcharges, some of which may be recovered by the State. In fact, 10 in the first nine months of reduced prescription drug costs resulting 11 from the reverse auction, savings to New Jersey taxpayers, State 12 and local governments, and public school districts have exceeded 13 projections; State and local government spending on prescription 14 medicines has fallen by 25 percent.

State, local government, and public school employees will
experience a reduction in overall healthcare premiums in 2019 due
in substantial part to the reduced costs of prescription drugs
achieved through the PBM reverse auction conducted in 2017.

19 It is anticipated that expeditious execution of the PBM reverse 20 auction to award a new PBM contract will save the State of New 21 Jersey, local governments, and public school districts substantial 22 additional amounts of public funds.
