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4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 7 1. Section 3 of P.L.2005, c.310 (C.18A:6-113) is amended to 8 read as follows:
- 9 3. ¹[Within 180 days of the effective date of this act, the] The¹
- 10 State Board of Education shall revise the ¹[Core Curriculum
- 11 Content] New Jersey Student Learning 1 Standards in
- 12 Comprehensive Health and Physical Education to provide for
- 13 instruction in suicide prevention , and mental health as it relates to
- 14 <u>suicide prevention</u>, in an appropriate place in the curriculum of
- 15 [elementary school, middle school, and high school pupils]
- 16 students in ¹[each of the grades kindergarten through 12]
- 17 <u>elementary school, middle school, and high school</u>¹. The instruction
- 18 <u>shall incorporate evidence-based standards and shall be adapted to</u>
- 19 the age and understanding of the students. The instruction ¹[, at a
- 20 <u>minimum</u>, shall <u>lang</u> <u>include the following elements:</u>
- 21 <u>a. the concept of wellness including self-care and personal</u>
 22 <u>responsibility for one's own mental health and wellness;</u>
- b. the concept of mental health as an integral part of health;
 - c. recognition of the warning signs of suicide;
- d. awareness of the risk of suicide and self-harm;
- e. the relationship between mental health, substance abuse, and
 other negative coping behaviors;
- 28 <u>f. the negative impact of stigma and cultural attitudes toward</u> 29 <u>mental illness;</u>
- g. the implications of risk factors, protective factors, and
 resiliency on mental health and wellness; and
- h. identifying appropriate professionals, services, and family supports for suicide prevention.
- 34 (cf: P.L.2005, c.310, s.3)

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This act shall take effect immediately and shall first apply tothe first full school year following the date of enactment.
