SYNOPSIS

Requires Chief Technology Officer to establish "Anti-Hunger Link" for all State websites, providing information on emergency food services.

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AN ACT concerning emergency food services and supplementing
 Title 30 of the Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. a. The ¹State¹ Chief Technology Officer of the ¹New Jersey¹ 7 Office of Information Technology ¹[in, but not of, the Department of 8 the Treasury]¹, in consultation with the Commissioner of Human 9 Services and the ¹[Commissioner] <u>Secretary</u>¹ of Agriculture, shall 10 establish ¹and maintain¹ an "Anti-Hunger Link" on the official website 11 of every State executive department. The link shall direct the website 12 user to a dedicated Internet ¹ [page listing] website that lists¹ all of the 13 emergency food programs in the State, including, but not limited to, 14 emergency meal providers, food pantries, soup kitchens, child and 15 16 senior feeding programs, faith-based anti-hunger initiatives, and other 17 food programs.

b. The ¹State¹ Chief Technology Officer of the ¹New Jersey¹ 18 Office of Information Technology ¹[in, but not of, the Department of 19 the Treasury]¹, in consultation with the Commissioner of Human 20 Services and the ¹[Commissioner] Secretary¹ of Agriculture, shall 21 ¹establish and¹ maintain ¹[and update]¹ the ¹["Anti-Hunger Link" 22 and] <u>dedicated</u>¹ emergency food program ¹[website established 23 pursuant to webpage described in^1 subsection a. of this section ¹; 24 25 however, as deemed by the State Chief Technology Officer to be 26 appropriate, in consultation with the Commissioner of Human Services 27 and the Secretary of Agriculture, the dedicated emergency food 28 program webpage may be established, hosted, and maintained by a 29 nonprofit organization, pursuant to an agreement that is entered into 30 between the Department of the Treasury and the nonprofit 31 organization.

<u>c. The "Anti-Hunger Link" and dedicated emergency food</u>
 program webpage established under this section shall be regularly
 <u>updated</u>,¹ on a schedule to be determined by the ¹State¹ Chief
 Technology Officer.

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2. This act shall take effect on the first day of the seventh month
next following enactment, except that the ¹State¹ Chief Technology
Officer of the ¹New Jersey¹ Office of Information Technology may
take any anticipatory administrative action in advance as shall be
necessary for the implementation of this act.
