SYNOPSIS

Authorizes provision of certain health and social services to at-risk individuals during Code Blue alert.

1 AN ACT concerning Code Blue alerts and supplementing P.L.2017, 2 c.68 and Title 26 of the Revised Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. The Commissioner of Health shall establish guidelines for 8 health care and social services to be offered to at-risk individuals at 9 emergency warming centers during a Code Blue alert declared 10 pursuant to section 3 of P.L.2017, c.68 (App.A:9-43.20). 11 a. Services offered may include, but shall not be limited to: 12 (1) the provision of health care services deemed appropriate by 13 the commissioner; (2) the administration of vaccines deemed appropriate by the 14 15 commissioner; (3) substance abuse intervention and treatment referral services; 16 17 (4) mental health assessment and treatment referral services; and 18 (5) the provision of social services deemed appropriate by the 19 commissioner. 20 b. The commissioner may require training related to the provision of services during a Code Blue alert as a condition of 21 22 registration in the Code Blue Alert Services Registry established 23 pursuant to section 2 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the 24 Legislature as this bill). 25 c. The commissioner shall establish a form for identification 26 cards issued pursuant to subsection b. of section 2 of P.L. 27 c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). 28 29 2. A coordinator may establish a registry of healthcare workers, 30 social services providers, and support services personnel who 31 voluntarily consent to provide health care, social services, and 32 support services to at-risk individuals during a Code Blue alert in 33 accordance with guidelines established by the Commissioner of 34 Health pursuant to section 1 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). This registry shall be known as 35 36 the Code Blue Alert Services Registry. a. 37 The coordinator may identify an area of an emergency warming center as a location to provide services authorized by the 38 39 commissioner pursuant to section 1 of P.L. , c. (C.) 40 (pending before the Legislature as this bill). 41 b. The coordinator may issue identification cards to personnel 42 included in the registry established under this section that: 43 (1) identify the health care, social services, or support services 44 personnel; 45 (2) identify any professional license or certification held by the 46 individual; and (3) indicate, if required under current law, that the individual is 47 48 registered as a New Jersey health care worker, social services 49 provider, or support services personnel.

c. Upon the declaration of a Code Blue alert, the coordinator
may direct that an emergency warming center may provide services
in accordance with section 1 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending
before the Legislature as this bill).

5 d. In the event a coordinator declares a Code Blue alert, the 6 coordinator may direct health care workers, social services 7 providers, and support services personnel registered under this 8 section who are willing to provide services on a voluntary basis to 9 proceed to a warming shelter to provide services in accordance with 10 section 1 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). 11

e. Health care workers, social services providers, and support
services personnel registered under this section may volunteer to
provide services at an emergency warming center during a Code
Blue alert in accordance with section 1 of P.L., c. (C.)
(pending before the Legislature as this bill).

17 f. Health care workers and support services personnel 18 registered under this section who provide health care services on a 19 voluntary basis shall not be liable for any civil damages as a result 20 of the person's acts or omissions in providing medical care or 21 treatment during a Code Blue alert in good faith and in accordance 22 with the provisions of this act.

- 3. This act shall take effect on the first day of the fourth monthnext following the date of enactment.
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STATEMENT

This bill authorizes the provision of certain health and social
services to at-risk individuals during a Code Blue alert initiated in
response to certain cold weather events.

Under current law, each county, through its office of emergency
management, is responsible for establishing a plan for issuing Code
Blue alerts to municipalities, social service agencies, and non-profit
organizations that provide services to at-risk individuals located in the
county. The plans are required to include the provision of emergency
warming centers during a Code Blue alert.

Currently, a Code Blue alert is to be declared when National
Weather Service forecasts and advisories predict that temperatures: (1)
will reach 25 degrees Fahrenheit or lower without precipitation or 32
degrees Fahrenheit or lower with precipitation; or (2) the National
Weather Service windchill temperature will be zero degrees Fahrenheit
or less for a period of two hours or more.

This bill directs the Commissioner of Health to establish guidelines for health care and social services to be offered to at-risk individuals at emergency warming centers during a Code Blue alert. Services to be offered may include, but not be limited to: the provision of health care services, vaccinations, and social services

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deemed appropriate by the commissioner; substance abuse intervention and treatment referral services; and mental health assessment and treatment referral services. The commissioner is required to establish a form for identification cards to be issued to those registered to provide services, and may require training related to the provision of services during a Code Blue alert as a condition of registration.

8 The bill authorizes a coordinator to establish a registry of 9 healthcare workers, social services providers, and support services 10 personnel who voluntarily consent to provide health care, social 11 services, and support services to at-risk individuals during a Code 12 Blue alert in accordance with the guidelines established by the commissioner. The coordinator is authorized to identify an area of 13 14 an emergency warming center as a location to provide services 15 authorized by the commissioner and to issue identification cards to 16 personnel included in the registry. The identification cards are to 17 identify the health care, social services, or support services 18 personnel; identify any professional license or certification held by 19 the individual; and indicate, if required under current law, that the 20 individual is registered as a New Jersey health care worker, social 21 services provider, or support services personnel.

22 Under the bill, the coordinator may direct that an emergency 23 warming center may provide services during a Code Blue alert and 24 authorizes registered health care workers, social services providers, 25 and support services personnel to voluntarily provide services at an 26 emergency warming center. The bill further provides that 27 registered health care workers or support services personnel who 28 provide health care services on a voluntary basis are not to be liable 29 for any civil damages as a result of the person's acts or omissions in 30 providing medical care or treatment during a Code Blue alert in 31 good faith and in accordance with the provisions of this bill.
