This act shall take effect immediately. 16 17 18 **STATEMENT** 19 20 This bill would prohibit a municipality, county, or any other local government from imposing penalties or fines on an alarm 21 company for a false alarm not caused by an operational error, 22 23 improper installation of an alarm, or the provision of defective 24 equipment attributable to the alarm company.
