Establishes civil action for damages for injury or death of certain animals in certain circumstances.

1 AN ACT concerning civil actions for damages for injury or death of  
2 certain animals and supplementing Title 2A of the New Jersey  
3 Statutes.

5 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
6 *of New Jersey:*

8 1. a. As used in this act “animal” includes any pet dog or pet  
9 cat normally maintained in or near the household of the owner.  
10 “Animal” includes any service animal or guide dog or a search and  
11 rescue dog.

12 b. Any person who has a right of ownership in an animal that is  
13 injured or killed as a result of an unlawful and intentional, or a  
14 negligent act of another may bring a civil action to recover damages  
15 sustained by that owner. Damages may include, but are not limited  
16 to, the monetary value of the animal, veterinary expenses incurred  
17 on behalf of the animal, any other expenses incurred by the owner  
18 in rectifying the effects of the cruelty, pain, and suffering of the  
19 animal, and, as set forth in subsection c. of this section,  
20 compensation for emotional distress suffered by the owner. If the  
21 killed or injured animal was a service animal or guide dog or a  
22 search and rescue dog, then the value of that animal may include the  
23 cost of any specialized training the animal received.

24 c. Noneconomic damages awarded pursuant to this section  
25 shall be limited to compensation for the loss of the reasonably  
26 expected society, companionship, love and affection of the animal.  
27 Noneconomic damages shall be limited to \$5000.

29 2. Every action at law for an injury or death to an animal  
30 brought by the person having a right of ownership in that animal  
31 shall be commenced within two years of the date of the injury or  
32 death.

34 3. This act shall not apply to any governmental agency, or its  
35 employees, negligently causing the death of an animal while acting  
36 on behalf of public health or animal welfare. This act shall not be  
37 construed to authorize any award of noneconomic damages in an  
38 action for professional negligence against a licensed veterinarian.

40 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

43 STATEMENT

45 This bill establishes a civil action for damages that may be  
46 brought by any person who has a right of ownership in an animal  
47 that is injured or killed as a result of an unlawful and intentional, or  
48 a negligent act of another. “Animal” as used in the bill includes any

1 pet dog or pet cat normally maintained in or near the household of  
2 the owner and any service animal or guide dog or a search and  
3 rescue dog.

4 The bill provides that the damages sought may include: the  
5 monetary value of the animal, veterinary expenses incurred on  
6 behalf of the animal, any other expenses incurred by the owner in  
7 rectifying the effects of the cruelty, pain, and suffering of the  
8 animal, and compensation for emotional distress suffered by the  
9 owner. If the killed or injured animal was a service animal or guide  
10 dog or a search and rescue dog, then the value of that animal may  
11 include the cost of any specialized training the animal received.

12 The compensation for emotional distress, that is, the  
13 noneconomic damages, is limited to compensation for the loss of  
14 the reasonably expected society, companionship, love and affection  
15 of the animal. The bill provides that these noneconomic damages  
16 are capped at \$5000.

17 This bill also provides that the civil action for damages does not  
18 apply to any governmental agency, or its employees, negligently  
19 causing the death of an animal while acting on behalf of public  
20 health or animal welfare. It also states that it should not be  
21 construed to authorize any award of noneconomic damages in an  
22 action for professional negligence against a licensed veterinarian.
