Proposes an amendment to the Constitution to describe the manner in which the Legislature shall provide for the maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of free public schools.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION proposing to amend Article VIII, 1 2 Section IV, paragraph 1 of the Constitution of the State of New 3 Jersey. 4 5 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Senate of the State of New Jersey (the 6 General Assembly concurring): 7 8 1. The following proposed amendment to the Constitution of 9 the State of New Jersey is agreed to: 10 PROPOSED AMENDMENT 11 12 13 Amend Article VIII, Section IV, paragraph 1, to read as follows: 14 1. The Legislature shall provide for the maintenance and 15 support of a thorough and efficient system of free public schools for the instruction of all the children in the State between the ages of 16 17 five and 18 years. Maintenance and support shall be provided 18 through the enactment, from time to time, of laws prescribing the 19 components of a thorough and efficient system of free public 20 schools. These laws shall also provide for the funding of a system 21 of free public schools in the manner and to the extent the 22 Legislature determines to be appropriate, including, but not limited 23 to, the amount of funds to be provided by the State and by the local 24 school districts, the purposes for which these funds are to be 25 expended, the formulas pursuant to which these funds are to be 26 allocated, and the manner and means by which these funds are to be 27 raised; but nothing herein contained shall be construed as requiring any minimum or establishing any maximum amount of funds to be 28 29 provided by the State, or in any way restricting, limiting, or 30 otherwise affecting the right of the Legislature to regulate the 31 funding of a thorough and efficient system of free public schools in 32 the manner and to the extent the Legislature determines to be 33 appropriate. 34 35 2. When this proposed amendment to the Constitution is finally 36 agreed to, pursuant to Article IX, paragraph 1 of the Constitution, it 37 shall be submitted to the people at the next general election 38 occurring more than three months after the final agreement and 39 shall be published at least once in at least one newspaper of each 40 county designated by the President of the Senate and the Speaker 41 of the General Assembly and the Secretary of State, not less than 42 three months prior to the general election. 43 3. This proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be 44 submitted to the people at the election in the following manner and 45 form:

1 There shall be printed on each official ballot to be used at the 2 general election, the following:

3 a. In every municipality in which voting machines are not used,

- 4 a legend which shall immediately precede the question, as follows:
- 5 If you favor the proposition printed below make a cross (x), plus
- 6 (+) or check (T) in the square opposite the word "Yes."
- 7 If you are opposed thereto make a cross (x), plus (+) or check (T)
- 8 in the square opposite the word "No."
- 9 b. In every municipality the following question:

YES	Shall the amendment of Article VIII, Section IV, paragraph 1 of the Constitution of the State of New Jersey, providing that the maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of free public schools shall be provided through the enactment, from time to time, of laws prescribing the components of the system, and providing that nothing shall be construed as requiring any minimum or establishing any maximum amount of funds to be provided by the State, or as in any way restricting, limiting, or otherwise affecting the right of the Legislature to regulate the funding of a thorough and efficient system of free public schools in the manner and to the extent the Legislature determines to be appropriate, be approved?

NO	This constitutional amendment describes the manner in which the Legislature shall provide for the maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of free public schools.

STATEMENT

15 This proposed amendment would require the enactment of laws 16 prescribing the components of a thorough and efficient system of 17 free public schools. While these laws would also be required to 18 provide for the funding of a system of free public schools, this 19 proposed amendment specifies that nothing herein contained shall 20 be construed as requiring any minimum or establishing any
