SYNOPSIS

Proposes constitutional amendment requiring Legislature to enact statute authorizing \$200 property tax credit for primary residence of volunteer firefighter or first aid squad member.

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A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION proposing to amend Article VIII, 1 2 Section I of the Constitution of the State of New Jersey by 3 adding a new paragraph 8. 4 5 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Senate of the State of New Jersey (the General Assembly concurring): 6 7 8 1. The following proposed amendment to the Constitution of 9 the State of New Jersey is agreed to: 10 PROPOSED AMENDMENT 11 12 13 Amend Article VIII, Section I by adding a new paragraph 8 to 14 read as follows: 15 8. The Legislature shall adopt a statute entitling a resident of 16 this State, who has been for the entire tax year an active member of 17 a volunteer fire company or volunteer first aid or rescue squad or association, or an active, volunteer member of a part-paid fire 18 19 department, incorporated pursuant to the laws of this State and 20 serving one or more counties or municipalities in this State, to a 21 property tax credit of \$200 against a tax bill for taxes on residential 22 real property owned by and serving as the primary residence of that 23 person. Any statute so enacted shall require that the State annually 24 reimburse municipalities for the total amount of property tax credits 25 provided pursuant to this paragraph. 26 27 2. When this proposed amendment to the Constitution is finally 28 agreed to pursuant to Article IX, paragraph 1 of the Constitution, it shall be submitted to the people at the next general election 29 occurring more than three months after the final agreement and 30 31 shall be published at least once in at least one newspaper of each 32 county designated by the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the 33 General Assembly, and the Attorney General, not less than three months prior to the general election. 34 35 36 This proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be 3. 37 submitted to the people at that election in the following manner and 38 form: 39 There shall be printed on each official ballot to be used at the 40 general election, the following: 41 a. In every municipality in which voting machines are not used, 42 a legend which shall immediately precede the question as follows: 43 If you favor the proposition printed below make a cross (X), plus 44 (+), or check (\checkmark) in the square opposite the word "Yes." If you are opposed thereto make a cross (X), plus (+), or check (\checkmark) in the 45 square opposite the word "No." 46 47 In every municipality the following question:

YES	Do you approve amending the Constitution to provide a \$200 property tax credit for the homes of certain firefighters and first aid or rescue squad members?
NO	INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT This amendment would require a \$200 property tax credit for the home of a volunteer firefighter, or volunteer first aid or rescue squad member. The cost of the credits would not be paid by municipal taxpayers. The State would reimburse municipalities for the cost of the tax credits.

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STATEMENT

5 This proposed constitutional amendment would require the Legislature to enact a statute entitling State residents, who have 6 7 been for the entire tax year active members of a volunteer fire 8 company or volunteer first aid or rescue squad or association, or 9 active, volunteer members of a part-paid fire department, 10 incorporated pursuant to State law and serving one or more counties or municipalities, to a credit of \$200 against the property tax bill on 11 12 their owner-occupied primary residence.

Any statute enacted pursuant to this proposed amendment would
require the State to annually reimburse municipalities for the total
amount of property tax credits provided pursuant to this
amendment.
