1	A JOINT RESOLUTION urging the United States Congress to pass
2	the Equal Rights Amendment.
3	
4	WHEREAS, The Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) is a proposed
5	amendment to the United States Constitution designed to guarantee
6	equal rights for women; and
7	WHEREAS, The ERA states: "Equality of rights under the law shall
8	not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on
9	account of sex - the ERA establishes within the United States
10 11	Constitution the unambiguous and unassailable rights of women
12	under the law"; and WHEREAS, New Jersey suffragist leader Alice Paul, who was
13	instrumental in the passage of the 19th amendment which granted
14	women the right to vote, and Crystal Eastman authored the ERA in
15	1923. It was introduced for the first time in the United States
16	Congress that same year; and
17	WHEREAS, In 1972, the ERA passed the United State Congress and
18	was submitted to the state legislatures for ratification. Congress set
19	a ratification deadline of March 22, 1979, and through 1977, 35 of
20	the required 38 states had ratified the amendment; and
21	WHEREAS, In 1978, a joint resolution of the United States Congress
22	extended the deadline for ratification to June 30, 1982; and
23	WHEREAS, Five states rescinded their ratifications of the ERA prior to
24	June 30, 1982, and no other states ratified the amendment between
25	1979 and the 1982 deadline. As a result, the ERA was not adopted
26	as part of the Constitution; and
27	WHEREAS, The ERA has been reintroduced in every session of the
28	United States Congress since 1982. The last time it received a floor
29 30	vote in Congress was 1983; and WHEREAS, On January 23, 2017 Senators Bob Menendez (D-N.J.),
31	Cory Booker (D-N.J.), Sherrod Brown (D-Ohio), Ben Cardin (D-
32	Md.), Chris Coons (D-Del.), Dianne Feinstein (D-Calif.), Kirsten
33	Gillibrand (D-N.Y.), and Ed Markey (D-Mass.) reintroduced the
34	ERA in the United States Congress; and
35	WHEREAS, Passage of the ERA by the United States Congress and its
36	ratification by state legislatures would affirm this country's
37	commitment to equal rights for women and introduce the idea of
38	sex equality as a fundamental principle in the United States
39	Constitution; now, therefore,

41	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and General Assembly of the
