Prohibits State's participation in multi-state cap-and-trade program to reduce carbon emissions from transportation sector.

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AN ACT prohibiting the State's participation in a multi-state cap and-trade program to reduce carbon emissions from the
 transportation sector, and supplementing Title 26 of the Revised
 Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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9 1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, rule, or 10 regulation to the contrary, no State agency, or representative or 11 employee thereof, shall:

12 (1) enter any agreement or arrangement with the appropriate representatives of other states, including the formation of a for-13 14 profit or non-profit corporation, any form of association, alliance, 15 compact, or commission, or any other form of organization, in this or another state, established for the purpose of creating a cap and 16 17 trade program for carbon emissions from combustion gas and diesel 18 engines or any similar multi-state program that would cap and 19 reduce the amount of allowable carbon emissions from the 20 combustion of transportation fuels; or

(2) adopt any rules or regulations that would establish a multistate cap and trade program to limit carbon emissions from
combustion gas and diesel engines or any similar program that
would cap and reduce the amount of allowable carbon emissions
from the combustion of transportation fuels.

b. Any action taken by a State agency, or representative or employee thereof, prior to the date of enactment of this act that is inconsistent with the prohibition established pursuant to subsection a. of this section is hereby invalidated, and the State agency, or representative or employee thereof, as appropriate, shall take all necessary action to withdraw from the agreement or arrangement.

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- 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
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STATEMENT

38 This bill would prohibit the State from participating in a multi-39 state initiative cap-and-trade program to reduce carbon emissions from the transportation sector. Specifically, the bill would prohibit 40 41 any State agency, or representative or employee thereof, from: (1) 42 entering any agreement or arrangement with the appropriate 43 representatives of other states, including the formation of a for-44 profit or non-profit corporation, any form of association, alliance, 45 compact, or commission, or any other form of organization, in this 46 or another state, established for the purpose of creating a cap and 47 trade program for carbon emissions from combustion gas and diesel 48 engines or any similar multi-state program that would cap and

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reduce the amount of allowable carbon emissions from the combustion of transportation fuels; and (2) adopting any rules or regulations that would establish a multi-state cap and trade program to limit carbon emissions from combustion gas and diesel engines or any similar multi-state program that would cap and reduce the amount of allowable carbon emissions from the combustion of transportation fuels.

8 In December 2018, the Commissioner of Environmental 9 Protection announced that New Jersey was joining with other Northeast and Mid-Atlantic states to design a new regional low-10 11 carbon transportation policy proposal to reduce greenhouse gas 12 emissions from the transportation sector, called the "Transportation and Climate Initiative." Other participants include Connecticut, 13 14 Delaware, Maryland, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, 15 Vermont, Virginia, and Washington, D.C. According to the 16 announcement, the initiative includes a proposal to cap and reduce 17 carbon emissions from the combustion of transportation fuels, and 18 investing proceeds from the program into low-carbon and more 19 resilient transportation infrastructure. While the reduction of carbon emissions is an important goal, it is also important to protect 20 21 consumers from price increases that would likely result from a cap 22 and trade program.
