SYNOPSIS

Provides that student-athlete who sustains concussion must return to regular school activities prior to return to competition; requires school districts to implement six-step return-to-competition process.

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evaluation and management of concussions, and receives written 1 clearance from a physician trained in the evaluation and 2 3 management of concussions to return to competition or practice; 4 and 5 b. ¹[he] the student-athlete or cheerleader¹ returns to regular school activities and is no longer experiencing symptoms of the 6 7 injury when conducting those activities. 8 The return of a student-athlete or cheerleader to competition or 9 practice shall be in accordance with the graduated, ¹[five-step] sixstep¹ <u>"Return to Play Progression" recommendations</u> ¹and any 10
