This act shall take effect immediately. 23 24 25 **STATEMENT** 26 27 This bill requires the Attorney General to report bias 28 intimidation offenses to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) 29 for inclusion in the FBI's annual report on hate crime statistics. Under current law, municipal and county law enforcement 30 31 agencies are required to include information regarding bias crimes 32 in their quarterly reports of crime submitted to the Attorney 33 General. The Attorney General is to issue an annual report 34 containing the results. 35 Under the provisions of this bill, the Attorney General is 36 required to submit to the FBI for inclusion in the FBI's annual 37 report on hate crime statistics the portion of the State's annual 38 report containing information relating to any offense directed 39 against a person or group, or their property, by reason of their race, color, religion, gender, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity 40 41 or expression, national origin, or ethnicity which is gathered under 42 current law.
