#### **SYNOPSIS**

Designates portion of State Highway Route 27 in Princeton as "Patrolman Billie D. Ellis Memorial Highway."

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

Introduced Pending Technical Review by Legislative Counsel.



1	AN ACT designating the portion of State Highway Route 27 in the
2	municipality of Princeton, in the county of Mercer, as the
3	"Patrolman Billie D. Ellis Memorial Highway."
4	
5	WHEREAS, Patrolman Billie D. Ellis was an extraordinary public
6	servant who served the people of his community as a patrolman or
7	the Princeton Police Department; and
8	WHEREAS, On August 19, 1955, Patrick Maloney and Kenneth
9	Werkman, Jr., both 15 years of age, embarked on a canoe trip near
10	the dam separating the Millstone River from Lake Carnegie in the
11	municipality of Princeton; and
12	WHEREAS, The effects of Hurricane Diane caused water to pour over
13	the Lake Carnegie Dam, resulting in swirling rapids that caused the
14	boat carrying the two young men to capsize; and
15	WHEREAS, While off duty, Patrolman Ellis responded to a radio call
16	about the two young men in distress, arrived on the scene, boarded
17	a row boat along with other officers, and set out for the dam; and
18	WHEREAS, Due to the extreme turbulence in the waters, Patrolman
19	Ellis became separated from his boat while attempting to save the
20	young men; and
21	WHEREAS, On that day, Patrolman Ellis and the two young men
22	tragically perished in the surging water; and
23	WHEREAS, Patrolman Ellis was survived by his wife, Barbara, his
<ul><li>24</li><li>25</li></ul>	sons Robert and Gary, and his daughter Sally, who was born after his death; and
26	WHEREAS, Although the details of Patrolman Ellis's untimely death
27	are troubling, those events serve as a reminder of the heroism and
28	bravery of Patrolman Ellis, who at his own peril provided aid to
29	those in distress, and of those officers who heroically serve and
30	protect the public; and
31	WHEREAS, It is fitting and proper that Patrolman Billie D. Ellis be
32	remembered by designating the portion of State Highway Route 27
33	in the municipality of Princeton in his memory; now, therefore,
34	
35	BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
36	of New Jersey:
37	
38	1. The Commissioner of Transportation shall designate the
39	portion of State Highway Route 27, extending from milepost 0 to
40	milepost 3.04, in the municipality of Princeton as the "Patrolman
41	Billie D. Ellis Memorial Highway" and erect appropriate signs
42	bearing this designation and dedication.

44	2. State or other public funds shall not be used for producing
45	purchasing, or erecting signs bearing the designation established
46	pursuant to section 1 of this act. The Commissioner of
47	Transportation is authorized to receive gifts, grants, or other

financial assistance from private sources for the purpose of funding

or reimbursing the Department of Transportation for the costs associated with producing, purchasing, erecting, and maintaining signs bearing the designation established pursuant to section 1 of this act and entering into agreements related thereto, with private sources, including, but not limited to, non-governmental non-profit, educational, or charitable entities or institutions. Work shall not proceed and funding shall not be accepted by the Department of Transportation until an agreement has been reached with a responsible party for paying the costs associated with producing, purchasing, erecting, and maintaining the signs.

3. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### **STATEMENT**

This bill designates the portion of State Highway Route 27, extending from milepost 0 to milepost 3.04 in the municipality of Princeton, as the "Patrolman Billie D. Ellis Memorial Highway" to honor the memory of Patrolman Billie D. Ellis, who was tragically killed while attempting to save the lives of two children on Lake Carnegie during a hurricane.

Consistent with Department of Transportation policy and other road designations, the bill provides that State or other public funds are not to be used for producing, purchasing, or erecting signs bearing the designation for the "Patrolman Billie D. Ellis Memorial Highway." The Commissioner of Transportation is authorized to receive financial assistance from private sources for the costs associated with producing, purchasing, erecting, and maintaining signs bearing the designation.
