Provides for voluntary contributions by taxpayers on gross income tax returns for New Jersey Commission on Cancer Research.

1 AN ACT concerning voluntary contributions through gross income 2 tax returns to support the New Jersey State Commission on 3 Cancer Research, supplementing chapter 9 of Title 54A of the 4 New Jersey Statutes. 5 6 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 7 of New Jersey: 8 9 1. a. There is established in the Department of the Treasury a 10 special fund to be known as the "New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research Charitable Contribution Check-Off Fund." 11 12 b. Each taxpayer shall have the opportunity to indicate on the 13 taxpayer's New Jersey gross income tax return that a portion of the 14 taxpayer's refund or an enclosed contribution shall be deposited in 15 the special fund. 16 c. The State Treasurer shall deposit all contributions collected 17 pursuant to this section in the "New Jersey State Commission on 18 Cancer Research Charitable Contribution Check-Off Fund." 19 d. The Legislature shall annually appropriate all funds 20 deposited in the "New Jersey State Commission on Cancer 21 Research Charitable Contribution Check-Off Fund" to the New 22 Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research, established pursuant 23 to section 4 of P.L.1983, c.6 (C.52:9U-4), for approved research 24 projects as defined in section 3 of P.L.1983, c.6 (C.52:9U-3). 25 26 2. This act shall take effect immediately and apply to taxable 27 years beginning on or after January 1 next following the date of 28 enactment. 29 30 31 **STATEMENT** 32 33 This bill establishes the "New Jersey State Commission on 34 Cancer Research Charitable Contribution Check-Off Fund" and 35 provides for a designation on the State gross income tax return that will permit taxpayers to make voluntary contributions to the fund to 36 37 support cancer research projects that are approved by the New 38 Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research. All taxpayer 39 contributions will be provided to the commission. The bill does not 40 permit any amount to be retained by the State from contribution 41 amounts to cover administrative costs of the tax return check-off. 42 The commission currently receives funding from more narrow and 43 specific funding sources including: State appropriations from 44 taxpayer donations from three more specific charitable check-offs 45 on the State gross income tax return (Breast Cancer Research Fund, 46 N.J.S.A.54A:9-25.8, Prostate Cancer Research Fund, 47 N.J.S.A.54A:9-25.22, and Lung Cancer Research Fund,

1 N.J.S.A.54A:9-25.27); proceeds from Conquer Cancer license plate

2 sales, N.J.S.A.39:3-27.90, and private donations.

3 The voluntary contributions under this bill will allow for more 4 general taxpayer support for approved scientific research projects 5 which focus on the genetic, biochemical, viral, microbiological, and environmental causes of cancer, and may include, but are not 6 7 limited to, behavioral, socio-economic, demographic, and psychosocial research or research into methods of clinical 8 9 treatment; or which focuses on pain management and palliative care 10 for persons diagnosed with cancer.
