## **SYNOPSIS**

Requires State Employment and Training Commission member to specialize in serving transgender communities.

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1 AN ACT concerning the State Employment and Training 2 Commission and amending P.L.1989, c.293. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 6 of P.L.1989, c.293 (C.34:15C-3) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 6. The commission shall consist of the following members: the 10 Governor, the Commissioners of Community Affairs, Education, 11 Human Services, and Labor and Workforce Development, the Chief 12 Executive Officer of the New Jersey Economic Development Authority, and the Secretary of Higher Education, all of whom shall 13 14 serve ex officio; one member of the Senate appointed by the 15 Governor, as recommended by the President of the Senate to serve 16 during the two-year legislative session in which the appointment is 17 made; one member of the General Assembly appointed by the 18 Governor, as recommended by the Speaker of the General 19 Assembly to serve during the two-year legislative session in which 20 the appointment is made; and a number of public members as 21 determined by the Governor pursuant to section 3111 of the 22 "Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act," (29 U.S.C. s.3111). 23 The public members shall be appointed by the Governor with the 24 advice and consent of the Senate for terms of three years, except 25 that of the public members first appointed by the Governor, not less 26 than 30% shall be appointed for three years, not less than 30% shall 27 be appointed for two years, and the others shall be appointed for 28 one year. Not more than half of the members appointed by the 29 Governor shall be of the same political party. Of the public 30 members appointed by the Governor, not less than five shall be 31 representatives of labor organizations nominated by a State-wide labor federation, and not less than three shall be representatives of 32 33 community-based organizations. One of the public members 34 appointed by the Governor shall specialize in serving transgender 35 communities. One of the members appointed by the Governor pursuant to section 3111 of the "Workforce Innovation and 36 37 Opportunity Act," (29 U.S.C. s.3111) to represent business on the 38 commission shall be a representative of the New Jersey Business 39 and Industry Association. The composition of the commission shall 40 be consistent with the composition required for a State workforce 41 development board pursuant to section 3111 of the "Workforce 42 Innovation and Opportunity Act," (29 U.S.C. s.3111). Each 43 member shall hold office for the term of appointment and until his 44 successor is appointed and qualified. A member appointed to fill a 45 vacancy occurring in the membership of the board for any reason

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1 other than the expiration of the term shall have a term of 2 appointment for the unexpired term only. All vacancies shall be 3 filled in the same manner as the original appointment. A member 4 may be appointed for any number of successive terms. Any member 5 appointed by the Governor may be removed from office by the 6 Governor, for cause, after a hearing and may be suspended by the 7 Governor pending the completion of the hearing. Members of the 8 board shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for 9 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as 10 members. Action may be taken and motions and resolutions may be 11 adopted by the board at a board meeting by an affirmative vote of a 12 majority of the members. The Governor shall select a chairperson 13 who shall be a nongovernmental member of the commission. 14 Advanced notification for, and copies of the minutes of, each 15 meeting of the commission shall be filed with the Governor, the 16 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the General Assembly.

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2. This act shall take effect 180 days after enactment.

#### STATEMENT

24 This bill requires a member of the State Employment and 25 Training Commission to specialize in serving transgender 26 communities. This implements a recommendation on employment 27 from the report of the New Jersey Transgender Equality Task Force. 28 Some studies have consistently found high rates of employment 29 discrimination against transgender individuals and high rates of 30 unemployment among transgender people, with higher rates for 31 transgender people of color. Employment discrimination can lead 32 transgender people to work in underground economies, which can 33 compound the effects of employment discrimination as well as 34 create issues with securing housing. Data from the 2015 United 35 States Transgender Survey found that in New Jersey, 16 percent of transgender people had lost a job because of their gender identity or 36 37 expression, 26 percent reported that they had been fired, not hired, 38 or denied a promotion because of their gender identity or 39 expression. This bill would ensure that strategies to enhance 40 employment opportunities would also serve transgender 41 populations.
