Authorizes creation of vertical motorcycle license plates.

## **A2954** SPACE

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AN ACT concerning motorcycle license plates, amending R.S.39:3 33, and supplementing chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised
 Statutes.

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. R.S.39:3-33 is amended to read as follows:

9 39:3-33. The owner of an automobile which is driven on the 10 public highways of this State shall display not less than 12 inches nor more than 48 inches from the ground in a horizontal position, 11 12 and in such a way as not to swing, an identification mark or marks 13 to be furnished by the [division] commission; provided, that if two 14 marks are issued [they] one mark shall be displayed on the front 15 and one mark shall be displayed on the rear of the vehicle; and 16 provided, further, that if only one mark is issued it shall be 17 displayed on the rear of the vehicle; and provided, further, that the 18 rear identification mark may be displayed more than 48 inches from 19 the ground on tank trucks, trailers, and other commercial vehicles carrying inflammable liquids and on sanitation vehicles which are 20 21 used to collect, transport, and dispose of garbage, solid wastes, and 22 refuse.

23 Motorcycles shall also display an identification mark or 24 identification marks in a horizontal position or in a vertical position, 25 as prescribed pursuant to section 2 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending 26 before the Legislature as this bill); provided, that if two marks are 27 issued [they] one mark shall be displayed on the front and one 28 mark shall be displayed on the rear of the motorcycle; and provided, 29 further, that if only one mark is issued it shall be displayed on the 30 rear of the motorcycle.

The identification mark or marks shall contain the number of the registration certificate of the vehicle and shall be of such design and material as prescribed pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1989, c.202 (C.39:3-33.9). All identification marks shall be kept clear and distinct and free from grease, dust, or other blurring matter, so as to be plainly visible at all times of the day and night.

[No] <u>A</u> person shall <u>not</u> drive a motor vehicle which has a
license plate frame or identification marker holder that conceals or
otherwise obscures any part of any marking imprinted upon the
vehicle's registration plate or any part of any insert which the
[director] <u>chief administrator</u>, as hereinafter provided, issues to be
inserted in and attached to that registration plate or marker.

The [director] <u>chief administrator</u> is authorized and empowered
to issue registration plate inserts, to be inserted in and attached to
the registration plates or markers described herein. [They] <u>The</u>

registration plate inserts may be issued in the place of new
registration plates or markers; and inscribed thereon, in numerals,
shall be the year in which registration of the vehicle has been
granted.

5 [No] <u>A</u> person shall <u>not</u> drive a motor vehicle <u>if</u> the owner of 6 [which] the motor vehicle has not complied with the provisions of 7 [this subtitle] Title 39 concerning the proper registration and 8 identification thereof [, nor] . A person shall not drive a motor 9 vehicle which displays a fictitious number, or a number other than 10 that designated for the motor vehicle in its registration certificate. 11 During the period of time between the application for motor vehicle 12 registration and the receipt of registration plates from the **[**division, 13 no] commission, a person shall not affix a plate or marker for the 14 purpose of advertisement in the position on a motor vehicle 15 normally reserved for the display of the registration plates required 16 by this section if the plate or marker is designed with a combination 17 of letters, numbers, colors, or words to resemble the registration 18 plates required by this section.

A person convicted of displaying a fictitious number, as
prohibited herein, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding
[\$500.00] <u>\$500</u> or imprisonment in the county jail for not more
than 60 days.

23 A person violating any other provision of this section shall be 24 subject to a fine not exceeding [\$100.00] <u>\$100</u>. In default of the 25 payment thereof, there shall be imposed an imprisonment in the 26 county jail for a period not exceeding 10 days. A person convicted 27 of a second offense of the same violation may be fined in double the 28 amount herein prescribed for the first offense and may, in default of 29 the payment thereof, be punished by imprisonment in the county jail 30 for a period not exceeding 20 days. These penalties shall not apply 31 to the display of a fictitious number.

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34 2. (New section) a. Upon proper application, the Chief 35 Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall 36 issue registration plates that are to be displayed in a vertical 37 position for any motorcycle owned or leased and registered in the 38 State. The vertical motorcycle registration plates shall contain an 39 identification mark or identification marks to be furnished by the 40 commission arranged in a vertical alignment. The vertical 41 motorcycle registration plates shall be subject to the provisions of 42 R.S.39:3-33, except as hereinafter otherwise specifically provided.

A vertical motorcycle registration plate shall only be displayed
in a vertical position and shall not be displayed in a horizontal
position. A registration plate for a motorcycle that contains an
identification mark or identification marks arranged in a horizontal

alignment shall only be displayed in a horizontal position and shall

2 not be displayed in a vertical position. Application for issuance of vertical motorcycle registration 3 b. plates shall be made to the chief administrator on forms and in a 4 manner prescribed by the chief administrator. 5 In order to be deemed complete, an application shall be accompanied by a fee of 6 7 \$20, payable to the commission, which shall be in addition to the 8 fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of a 9 motorcycle. 10 c. The chief administrator shall annually certify to the State 11 Treasurer the average cost per set of vertical motorcycle registration 12 plates incurred in the immediately preceding year by the 13 commission in producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability 14 of the vertical motorcycle registration plates. The annual 15 certification of the average cost per set of vertical motorcycle 16 registration plates shall be approved by the Joint Budget Oversight 17 Committee, or its successor. 18 The chief administrator shall notify eligible motorists of the d. 19 opportunity to obtain vertical motorcycle registration plates by 20 publicizing the availability of the vertical motorcycle registration 21 plates on the website of the commission. 22 23 3. This act shall take effect immediately, but shall remain 24 inoperative until the first day of the 12th month following 25 enactment. The chief administrator may take anticipatory actions in 26 advance of that date as may be necessary for the timely 27 implementation of P.L. , c. (C. ) (pending before the 28 Legislature as this bill). 29 30 31 **STATEMENT** 33 This bill authorizes the Chief Administrator (chief administrator) 34 of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (commission) to issue license plates for motorcycles, which are to be displayed in a 35 vertical position (vertical motorcycle license plates). The vertical 36 37 motorcycle license plates are to contain the identification mark or marks, which are furnished by the commission, arranged in a 38 39 vertical alignment. There is an application fee of \$20 for the 40 vertical motorcycle license plates, which is to be in addition to the 41 fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of a 42 motorcycle. 43 The chief administrator is required to annually certify the 44 average cost per set of vertical motorcycle license plates incurred in 45 the immediately preceding year by the commission in producing, 46 issuing, and publicizing the availability of the vertical motorcycle 47 license plates. The chief administrator is to notify eligible motorists

48 of the opportunity to obtain vertical motorcycle license plates by

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1 publicizing the availability of the vertical motorcycle license plates

2 on the website of the commission.

3 Under the bill, vertical motorcycle license plates are to only be

- 4 displayed in a vertical position and are not to be displayed in a
- 5 horizontal position. A license plate for a motorcycle that contains
- 6 an identification mark or identification marks arranged in a
- 7 horizontal alignment are to only be displayed in a horizontal
- 8 position and are not to be displayed in a vertical position.
