SYNOPSIS

Revises eligibility for convicted drug offenders to receive general assistance benefits under Work First New Jersey program.

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AN ACT concerning eligibility for Work First New Jersey General 1 2 Assistance benefits and amending P.L.1997, c.14. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 5 of P.L.1997, c.14 (C.44:10-48) is amended to read 8 as follows: 9 5. a. Only those persons who are United States citizens or 10 eligible aliens shall be eligible for benefits under the Work First New Jersey program. Single adults or couples without dependent 11 12 children who are legal aliens who meet federal requirements and 13 have applied for citizenship, shall not receive benefits for more than 14 six months unless (1) they attain citizenship, or (2) they have passed the English language and civics components for citizenship, and are 15 awaiting final determination of citizenship by the federal 16 17 Immigration and Naturalization Service. 18 The following persons shall not be eligible for assistance and b. 19 shall not be considered to be members of an assistance unit: 20 (1) non-needy caretakers, except that the eligibility of a 21 dependent child shall not be affected by the income or resources of 22 a non-needy caretaker; 23 (2) Supplemental Security Income recipients, except for the 24 purposes of receiving emergency assistance benefits pursuant to 25 section 8 of P.L.1997, c.14 (C.44:10-51); 26 (3) illegal aliens; 27 (4) other aliens who are not eligible aliens; 28 (5) a person absent from the home who is incarcerated in a 29 federal, State, county or local corrective facility or under the custody of correctional authorities, except as provided by regulation 30 31 of the commissioner; (6) a person who: is fleeing to avoid prosecution, custody or 32 33 confinement after conviction, under the laws of the jurisdiction 34 from which the person has fled, for a crime or an attempt to commit 35 a crime which is a felony or a high misdemeanor under the laws of the jurisdiction from which the person has fled; or is violating a 36 37 condition of probation or parole imposed under federal or state law; 38 (7) a person convicted on or after August 22, 1996 under federal 39 or state law of any offense which is classified as a felony or crime, 40 as appropriate, under the laws of the jurisdiction involved and 41 which has as an element the possession, use, or distribution of a 42 controlled substance as defined in section 102(6) of the federal "Controlled Substances Act" (21 U.S.C. s.802 (6)), who would 43 44 otherwise be eligible for general public assistance pursuant to 45 P.L.1947, c.156 (C.44:8-107 et seq.); except that such a person who

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is convicted of any such offense [which has as an element the 1 2 possession or use only of such a controlled substance may] shall be 3 eligible for Work First New Jersey general public assistance 4 benefits if the person enrolls in or has completed a licensed 5 residential or outpatient drug treatment program. An otherwise 6 eligible individual who has a past drug conviction shall be eligible 7 for general public assistance without enrolling in or completing a 8 drug treatment program if either: (1) an appropriate treatment 9 program is not available; or (2) the person is excused from enrolling 10 in a treatment program for good cause pursuant to regulation.

11 Eligibility for benefits for a person entering a licensed drug 12 treatment program which does not operate in a State correctional 13 facility or county jail shall commence upon the person's enrollment 14 in the drug treatment program, and shall continue during the 15 person's active participation in, and upon completion of, the drug 16 treatment program, except that during the person's active 17 participation in a drug treatment program and the first 60 days after 18 completion of a drug treatment program, the commissioner shall 19 provide for testing of the person to determine if the person is free of 20 any controlled substance. If the person is determined to not be free 21 of any controlled substance during the 60-day period, the person's 22 eligibility for benefits pursuant to this paragraph shall be 23 terminated; except that this provision shall not apply to the use of 24 prescription drugs by a person who is actively participating in a 25 drug treatment program, as prescribed by the drug treatment 26 program. The commissioner shall adopt regulations to carry out the 27 provisions of this paragraph, which shall include the criteria for 28 determining active participation in and completion of a drug 29 treatment program.

Eligibility for benefits for a person who completes a licensed residential drug treatment program which operates in a State correctional facility or county jail, in accordance with section 1 of P.L.2014, c.1 (C.26:2B-40), shall commence upon release from incarceration.

35 Cash benefits, less a personal needs allowance, for a person 36 receiving general public assistance benefits under the Work First 37 New Jersey program who is enrolled in and actively participating in 38 a licensed drug treatment program shall be issued directly to the 39 drug treatment provider to offset the cost of treatment. Upon 40 completion of the drug treatment program, the cash benefits shall be 41 then issued to the person. In the case of a delay in issuing cash 42 benefits to a person receiving Work First New Jersey general public 43 assistance benefits who has completed the drug treatment program, 44 the drug treatment provider shall transmit to the person those funds 45 received on behalf of that person after completion of the drug 46 treatment program;

47 (8) a person found to have fraudulently misrepresented his48 residence in order to obtain means-tested, public benefits in two or

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1 more states or jurisdictions, who shall be ineligible for benefits for 2 a period of 10 years from the date of conviction in a federal or state 3 court; or (9) a person who intentionally makes a false or misleading 4 5 statement or misrepresents, conceals or withholds facts for the purpose of receiving benefits, who shall be ineligible for benefits 6 7 for a period of six months for the first violation, 12 months for the 8 second violation, and permanently for the third violation. 9 A person who makes a false statement with the intent to c. 10 qualify for benefits and by reason thereof receives benefits for 11 which the person is not eligible is guilty of a crime of the fourth 12 degree. 13 d. Pursuant to the authorization provided to the states under 21 14 U.S.C. s.862a(d)(1), this State elects to exempt from the application 15 of 21 U.S.C. s.862a(a): 16 (1) needy persons and their dependent children domiciled in 17 New Jersey for the purposes of receiving benefits under the Work 18 First New Jersey program and food assistance under the federal "Food and Nutrition Act of 2008," Pub.L.110-234 (7 U.S.C. s.2011 19 20 et seq.); and 21 (2) single persons and married couples without dependent 22 children domiciled in New Jersey for the purposes of receiving food 23 assistance under Pub.L.110-234. 24 (cf: P.L.2016, c.69, s.1) 25 26 2. The Commissioner of Human Services shall, pursuant to the 27 "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), adopt rules and regulations to effectuate the purposes of this 28 29 act. 30 31 3. This act shall take effect immediately. 32 33 34 **STATEMENT** 35 36 This bill revises the eligibility requirements for general 37 assistance benefits under the Work First New Jersey program for 38 individuals convicted of an offense involving the use, possession, or 39 distribution of a controlled dangerous substance. 40 Currently, persons convicted of offenses involving the use or 41 possession of a controlled dangerous substance may be eligible for general assistance benefits if they enroll in or complete a licensed 42 drug treatment program, and persons convicted of an offense 43 44 involving the possession of a controlled dangerous substance are 45 permanently ineligible for benefits. Certain exceptions to the 46 requirement to complete a drug treatment program apply if no program was available or the applicant was excused from meeting 47

48 the requirement for good cause.

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1 This bill revises these restrictions to provide that anyone who is 2 convicted of an offense involving the use, possession, or 3 distribution of a controlled dangerous substance will be eligible for 4 general assistance benefits under the Work First New Jersey 5 program if the individual completes a drug treatment program or 6 otherwise qualifies for one of the current statutory exceptions.
