SYNOPSIS

Requires certain retailers to post signs regarding risks associated with use of beach umbrellas and requires anchoring of beach umbrellas.

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1 AN ACT concerning beach umbrellas and supplementing Title 56 2 and Title 13 of the Revised Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. a. Every retail mercantile establishment in this State that 8 sells or offers for sale beach umbrellas shall post a sign at the point 9 of display informing consumers of the risks associated with the use 10 of beach umbrellas. 11 The Director of the Division of Consumer Affairs shall adopt 12 rules and regulations pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure 13 Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.) to effectuate the 14 purposes of this act. 15 b. A retail mercantile establishment that violates the provisions 16 of subsection a. of this section shall be subject to a civil penalty of 17 \$500, which may be collected and enforced by the Director of the 18 Division of Consumer Affairs in the Department of Law and Public 19 Safety in a summary proceeding pursuant to the "Penalty 20 Enforcement Law of 1999," P.L.1999, c.274 (C.2A:58-10 et seq.). 21 The Superior Court shall have jurisdiction of proceedings for the 22 enforcement of the penalty provided by this section. 23 c. As used in this section: 24 "Beach umbrella" means a shade structure, commonly used on 25 the beach, consisting of a single, center pole with a shade fabric 26 affixed to a frame that can be lowered or raised along the pole. "Retail mercantile establishment" means any place of business 27 where merchandise is exposed or offered for sale at retail to 28 29 members of the consuming public. 30 31 2. a. A person shall not use a beach umbrella at a public beach 32 unless the beach umbrella is secured to the ground using an auger, 33 sandbag, or other anchoring device that restricts the uncontrolled 34 movement of the beach umbrella due to wind. This provision shall 35 only apply when the wind speed is 25 miles per hour or greater. b. A person who violates the provisions of subsection a. of this 36 37 section shall be subject to a civil penalty of \$50 for the first offense, 38 \$100 for the second offense, and \$250 for the third or subsequent 39 offense, which may be collected and enforced by the government 40 entity having control of the public beach in a summary proceeding pursuant to the "Penalty Enforcement Law of 1999," P.L.1999, 41 c.274 (C.2A:58-10 et seq.). If the violation is of a continuing 42 nature, each day during which the violation continues shall 43 44 constitute an additional, separate, and distinct offense. The 45 Superior Court and the municipal court shall have jurisdiction of 46 proceedings for the enforcement of the penalty provided by this 47 section. Any penalty recovered under this section shall be retained 48 by the enforcing government entity.

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1 The provisions of this section shall supersede and preempt c. 2 any county or municipal law, ordinance, resolution, or regulation 3 concerning the anchoring of beach umbrellas and the penalties established for failure to properly anchor a beach umbrella. 4 5 d. As used in this section: 6 "Beach umbrella" means a shade structure, commonly used on 7 the beach, consisting of a single, center pole with a shade fabric affixed to a frame that can be lowered or raised along the pole. 8 "Government entity having control of the public beach" means 9 10 the entity having supervisory authority over a public beach or its designee or agents, as applicable. 11 12 "Public beach" means a State, county, or municipal beach. 13 14 This act shall take effect on the first day of the fourth month 3. 15 after enactment. 16 17 18 **STATEMENT** 19 20 This bill requires certain retailers to post signs regarding the risks associated with the use of beach umbrellas and requires the 21 22 anchoring of beach umbrellas. 23 Specifically, under the provisions of this bill, every retail 24 mercantile establishment in this State is required to post a sign at 25 the point of display informing consumers of the risks associated 26 with the use of beach umbrellas. 27 The bill defines a "retail mercantile establishment" as a place of business where merchandise is exposed or offered for sale at retail 28 29 to members of the consuming public. 30 A retail mercantile establishment that fails to post a sign is 31 subject to a civil penalty of \$500. In addition, under the bill, a person is not to use a beach 32 33 umbrella at a public beach unless the beach umbrella is secured to 34 the ground using an auger, sandbag, or other anchoring device that 35 restricts the uncontrolled movement of the beach umbrella due to 36 wind. This provision would only apply when the wind speed is 25 37 miles per hour or greater. A person who violates this provision is subject to a civil penalty 38 39 of \$50 for the first offense, \$100 for the second offense, and \$250 40 for the third or subsequent offense. The bill also provides that the bill's provisions supersede and 41 42 preempt any county or municipal law, ordinance, resolution, or 43 regulation concerning the anchoring of beach umbrellas and the 44 penalties for failure to properly anchor a beach umbrella.
