Requires school districts to provide feminine hygiene products in certain public schools and requires State to pay costs.

1 AN ACT concerning the provision of feminine hygiene products in 2 public schools and supplementing chapter 33 of Title 18A of the 3 New Jersey Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. a. As used in this section, "feminine hygiene products" mean tampons and sanitary napkins for use in connection with the 9 10 menstrual cycle. 11 b. A school district shall ensure that students in each school educating students in grades 6 through 12, or any combination 12 thereof, in which 40 percent or more of its students reside in 13 households with a household income at or below the most recent 14 15 federal poverty guidelines multiplied by 1.85, have direct access to 16 feminine hygiene products in at least 50 percent of the school 17 bathrooms free of charge. Any costs incurred by a school district in providing an 18 c. 19 adequate supply of feminine hygiene products to meet the needs of 20 its students shall be borne by the State. 21 22 2. This act shall take effect in the first full school year 23 following the date of enactment. 24 25 26 **STATEMENT** 27 This bill requires school districts to ensure that students in 28 29 schools educating students in grades 6 through 12, or any 30 combination thereof, in which 40 percent or more of their students 31 reside in households with a household income at or below the most recent federal poverty guidelines multiplied by 1.85, have direct 32 33 access to feminine hygiene products in at least 50 percent of the school bathrooms free of charge. Any costs incurred by a school 34 district in complying with the provisions of this bill will be borne 35 by the State. For purposes of this bill, "feminine hygiene products" 36

37 mean tampons and sanitary napkins.
