SYNOPSIS

Establishes "New Jersey Farm to Public Institution of Higher Education Program."

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

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1 AN ACT establishing the "New Jersey Farm to Public Institution of 2 Higher Education Program," and supplementing Title 4 of the 3 **Revised Statutes.** 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey: 6 7 8 1. a. The Department of Agriculture shall develop a "New Jersey 9 Farm to Public Institution of Higher Education Program" and, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et 10 11 seq.), adopt rules and regulations for its implementation, including, but 12 not necessarily limited to, rules and regulations that: (1) provide encouragement for public institutions of higher 13 14 education that provide meal programs to expand or improve their 15 kitchen facilities to allow for the daily production of meals that incorporate more fresh, locally grown or produced farm produce, fruit 16 17 or other products; 18 (2) establish a bidding matrix that provides for public institutions 19 of higher education to purchase New Jersey grown food and allows 20 them to adopt price preferences for local agricultural and farm 21 products; 22 (3) in conjunction with the Secretary of Higher Education, develop 23 ways in which public institutions of higher education can increase the 24 procurement of locally grown or produced farm produce, fruit or other 25 products for use in meals; and 26 (4) create a public directory for New Jersey farmers with contact 27 information of purchasing agents at public institutions of higher 28 education, and another public directory for purchasers with information about qualified New Jersey farmers and distributors. 29 30 b. (1) The Department of Agriculture shall establish a "New 31 Jersey Farm to Public Institution of Higher Education" website that shall be designed to: 32 33 provide opportunities for the establishment of purchasing (a) 34 networks between and among farmers, distributors, and public 35 institutions of higher education; 36 (b) facilitate the development and refinement of promotional 37 events in association with "Jersey Fresh Farm to School Week"; and 38 (c) provide for the dissemination of information about, and the 39 website-based promotion of, these and other related events. 40 The department shall include on the "New Jersey Farm to Public 41 Institution of Higher Education" website a copy of any public contract 42 or other written agreement for the purchase of fresh foods and the 43 provision thereof to students, which has been entered into and 44 successfully implemented by a public institution of higher education. 45 (2) The department shall post, in a prominent location on the 46 homepage of its Internet website, a hyperlink that provides visitors 47 with direct access to the "New Jersey Farm to Public Institution of Higher Education" website established pursuant to this subsection. 48

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1 The Secretary of Agriculture may solicit and accept c. 2 contributions from private and public sources for the purpose of 3 providing support to help fund the "New Jersey Farm to Public 4 Institution of Higher Education Program," which encourages public 5 institutions of higher education to purchase produce from local 6 farmers to incorporate in meals throughout the growing season, and 7 to increase the amount of local fresh produce available for 8 consumption by students.

9 d. As used in this section, "public institution of higher 10 education" means Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, the 11 State colleges or universities, and public research universities 12 established pursuant to chapter 64 of Title 18A of the New Jersey 13 Statutes.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

20 This bill would establish the "New Jersey Farm to Public 21 Institution of Higher Education Program" in the Department of Agriculture. The bill requires the department to adopt regulations 22 23 that: (1) provide encouragement for public institutions of higher 24 education that provide meal programs to expand or improve their 25 kitchen facilities to allow for the daily production of meals that 26 incorporate more fresh, locally grown or produced farm produce, fruit 27 or other products; (2) establish a bidding matrix that provides for 28 public institutions of higher education to purchase New Jersey grown 29 food and allows them to adopt price preferences for local agricultural 30 and farm products; (3) in conjunction with the Secretary of Higher 31 Education, develop ways in which public institutions of higher 32 education can increase the procurement of locally grown or produced 33 farm produce, fruit or other products for use in meals; and (4) create a 34 public directory for New Jersey farmers with contact information of 35 purchasing agents at public institutions of higher education, and 36 another public directory for purchasers with information about 37 qualified New Jersey farmers and distributors.

The bill also requires the Department of Agriculture to establish a "New Jersey Farm to Public Institution of Higher Education Program" website that provides information on the program, and includes a copy of any public contract or other written agreement for the purchase of fresh foods and the provision thereof to students, which has been entered into and successfully implemented by a public institution of higher education.

45 Finally, the bill allows the Secretary of Agriculture to solicit and
