SYNOPSIS

Requires health insurance and Medicaid coverage for testing of coronavirus disease 2019 and for telemedicine and telehealth during coronavirus disease 2019 state of emergency.

Emergency declared by the Governor in Executive Order 103 of 28 29 2020, a carrier that offers a health benefits plan in this State shall 30 provide coverage and payment for expenses incurred in: 31 (1) the testing of coronavirus disease 2019, provided that a 32 health care professional in accordance with the provisions of 33 P.L.2017, c.117 (C.45:1-61 et al.) has issued a medical order for the 34 testing; and 35 (2) any health care services delivered to a covered person 36 through telemedicine or telehealth in accordance with the 37 provisions of P.L.2017, c.117 (C.45:1-61 et al.). 38 b. The coverage shall be provided to the same extent as for any 39 other health care services under the health benefits plan, except that 40 no cost-sharing shall be imposed on the coverage provided pursuant 41 to this section. c. As used in this section, "carrier," means an insurance 42 43 company, health service corporation, hospital service corporation, 44 medical service corporation, or health maintenance organization 45 authorized to issue health benefits plans in this State, and shall 46 include the State Health Benefits Program and the School Employees' Health Benefits Program. 47

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This act shall take effect immediately and shall apply to all
 health benefits plans currently in effect in the State, or that are
 delivered, issued, executed or renewed in this State, or approved for
 issuance or renewal in this State by the Commissioner of Banking
 and Insurance, on or after the effective date of this act.

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STATEMENT

10 This bill requires health insurance carriers (health, hospital and 11 medical service corporations, health maintenance organizations and 12 insurance companies), as well as the State and School Employees' 13 Health Benefits Programs and the State Medicaid program, to 14 provide coverage for expenses incurred in:

(1) the testing for coronavirus disease 2019, provided that a
licensed medical practitioner has issued a medical order for that
testing; and

(2) the delivery of health care services through telemedicine or
telehealth in accordance with the provisions of P.L.2017, c.117
(C.45:1-61 et al.).

The requirements of the bill remain in effect during the Public
Health Emergency and State of Emergency declared by the
Governor in Executive Order 103 of 2020.

The bill requires the coverage to be provided to the same extent as for any other services under the health benefits plan, except that no cost-sharing may be imposed on the coverage provided pursuant to the bill.

The bill takes effect immediately and applies to all health benefit plans currently in effect in the State, or that are delivered, issued, executed or renewed in this State, or approved for issuance or renewal in this State by the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance, on or after the effective date of the bill.
