SYNOPSIS

Permits professional and occupational licensing boards to expedite licensure of certain individuals during state of emergency or public health emergency.

1 AN ACT concerning professional and occupational licenses, and 2 supplementing P.L.1999, c.403 (C.45:1-7.1 et seq.). 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, during a 8 state of emergency declared by the Governor pursuant to 9 P.L.1942, c.251 (C.App.A:9-33 et seq.), or a public health 10 emergency declared by the Governor pursuant to P.L.2005, c.222 11 (C.26:13-1 et seq.), and with the approval of the Attorney General, 12 a professional or occupational licensing board within the Division 13 of Consumer Affairs in the Department of Law and Public Safety or, with regard to any industry regulated by the division, the 14 15 director of the division, as applicable, may grant a license, 16 certificate of registration or certification on an expedited basis to 17 any individual who holds a corresponding license, certificate of 18 registration or certification, in good standing, in another state. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary, and 19 20 to effectuate the purposes of this act, the board or director, as 21 applicable, may take additional action necessary to protect the 22 public health, safety and welfare, including but not limited to the 23 following: 24 a. Temporarily waive any requirements to undergo a criminal 25 history record background check as a condition of granting a 26 license, certificate of registration or certification by reciprocity 27 pursuant to this section; 28 b. Temporarily waive any requirement that licensure, 29 registration, or certification standards in another state be 30 substantially equivalent to the standards in this State as a condition 31 of granting a license, certificate of registration or certification by 32 reciprocity; 33 c. Temporarily waive any licensing, registration or certification 34 fees; 35 Temporarily waive any other requirements contained in d. 36 section 3 of P.L.2013, c.182 (C.45:1-7.5) or any other applicable 37 law; 38 Prescribe the duration and terms of any license, certificate of e. 39 registration or certification granted pursuant to this section; or 40 Require any individual granted a license, certificate of f. 41 registration or certification pursuant to this section to arrange and 42 agree to supervision by an individual holding a license, certificate 43 of registration or certification, in good standing, while practicing 44 the profession or occupation in this State. 45 46 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

3 This bill allows the director of the Division of Consumer Affairs 4 in the Department of Law and Public Safety, with the approval of 5 the Attorney General, to expedite the professional and occupational licensing process for out-of-state individuals when the New Jersey 6 7 Governor has declared a state of emergency. The individual 8 applying for a specific license, certificate of registration, or 9 certification in New Jersey must have a corresponding license, 10 certificate of registration or certification in good standing from another jurisdiction. The bill gives the director and applicable 11 boards the ability to waive certain requirements normally required 12 13 in the licensure process, such as a criminal history record 14 background check of an individual and payment of certain fees for 15 the license, certificate of registration or certification.
