#### **SYNOPSIS**

Requires State to enter into contract and coordinate with certain cooperative purchasing systems for procurement of COVID-19 related goods and services by school districts and county colleges.

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As reported by the Assembly Appropriations Committee on August 24, 2020, with amendments.

AN ACT concerning <sup>2</sup>[a State contract] contracts<sup>2</sup> for the purchase of COVID-19 related materials by school districts <sup>2</sup>and county colleges<sup>2</sup>.

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 8 1. a. Notwithstanding any provision of law, rule, or regulation 9 to the contrary, the Director of the Division of Purchase and 10 Property in the Department of the Treasury, in consultation with the 11 Commissioner of <sup>2</sup>[the Department of]<sup>2</sup> Education, shall award a contract or contracts, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 12 34 of Title 52 of the Revised Statutes, <sup>2</sup> and coordinate with the lead 13 agency of any State-approved cooperative purchasing system that 14 includes one or more boards of education, including those systems 15 established pursuant to the "Public Schools Contracts Law," 16 17 N.J.S.18A:18A-1 et seq., or the "Local Public Contracts Law," P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-1 et seq.),<sup>2</sup> for the procurement of 18 COVID-19 related goods and services, as specified by the 19 commissioner, that aid in meeting the COVID-19 guidelines issued 20 by the <sup>2</sup>United States <sup>2</sup> Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. 21 The director, in consultation with the commissioner, may make 22 23 awards to multiple bidders in accordance with section 1 of 24 P.L.1986, c.26 (C.52:34-12.1). Advertised bidding shall not be required to award a contract or contracts to obtain those goods and 25 services necessary to address the public exigency when the Division 26
  - b. The board of education of a school district, without advertising for bids, or after having rejected all bids obtained pursuant to advertising therefor, may purchase COVID-19 related goods and services, upon adoption of a resolution, through the contract or contracts for such goods and services entered into by the Division of Purchase and Property pursuant to the provisions of subsection a. of this section <sup>2</sup>or made available through a State-approved cooperative purchasing system of which the board of education is a member<sup>2</sup>.

- c. The Department of Education shall coordinate the purchase of COVID-19 related goods and services by school districts that seek to purchase the goods and services in accordance with subsection b. of this section.

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"School district" means a local or regional school district established pursuant to chapter 8 or chapter 13 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes, a county special services school district established pursuant to article 8 of chapter 46 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes, a county vocational school district established pursuant to article 3 of chapter 54 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes, and a district under full State intervention pursuant to P.L.1987, c.399 (C.18A:7A-34 et al.). 

1 The term "school district" shall also include a charter school established under P.L.1995, c.426 (C.18A:36A-1 et seq.) and a renaissance school established pursuant to P.L.2011, c.176 (C.18A:36C-1 et seq.).

Notwithstanding any provision of law, rule, or regulation 25 26 to the contrary, the Director of the Division of Purchase and 27 Property, in consultation with the Secretary of Higher Education, 28 shall award a contract or contracts, in accordance with the 29 provisions of chapter 34 of Title 52 of the Revised Statutes, and 30 coordinate with the lead agency of any State-approved cooperative 31 purchasing system that includes one or more county colleges, 32 including those systems established pursuant to the "County 33 College Contracts Law," P.L.1982, c.189 (C.18A:64A-25.1 et seq.), 34 or the "Local Public Contracts Law," P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-1 35 et seq.), for the procurement of COVID-19 related goods and 36 services, as specified by the secretary, that aid in meeting the 37 COVID-19 guidelines issued by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The director, in consultation with 38 39 the secretary, may make awards to multiple bidders in accordance 40 with section 1 of P.L.1986, c.26 (C.52:34-12.1). Advertised 41 bidding shall not be required to award a contract or contracts to 42 obtain those goods and services necessary to address the public 43 exigency when the Division of Purchase of Property provides 44 preapproval.

b. The board of trustees of a county college, without advertising for bids, or after having rejected all bids obtained pursuant to advertising therefor, may purchase COVID-19 related
