Establishes New Jersey Task Force on Long-Term Care Quality and Safety.

1 AN ACT establishing the New Jersey Task Force on Long-Term  
2 Care Quality and Safety.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State  
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. a. There is established the New Jersey Task Force on Long-  
8 Term Care Quality and Safety, which shall be tasked with  
9 developing recommendations to make changes to the long-term  
10 system of care to drive improvements in person-centered care,  
11 resident and staff safety, improvements in quality of care and  
12 services, workforce engagement and sustainability, and any other  
13 appropriate aspects of the long-term system of care in New Jersey  
14 as the task force elects to review. The task force shall specifically  
15 focus on:

16 (1) <sup>1</sup>**de**veloping factors to optimize the balance of services and  
17 supports;

18 (2) <sup>1</sup>**exp**anding home and community-based services <sup>1</sup>and  
19 recommending strategies to improve the balance between facility-  
20 based services and home and community-based services and  
21 supports<sup>1</sup>;

22 <sup>1</sup>**[(3)] (2)**<sup>1</sup> nursing home reforms, including implementing new  
23 care models, optimizing nursing home size and configurations to  
24 foster resident wellness and infection control, increasing clinical  
25 presence in nursing homes, and identifying appropriate nursing  
26 home staffing levels <sup>1</sup>**[and ratios based on]** for certain<sup>1</sup> resident  
27 acuity and special population needs; <sup>1</sup>**[and]**<sup>1</sup>

28 <sup>1</sup>**[(4)] (3)** maintaining the objectivity of the nursing home  
29 survey inspections and the cited deficiency appeals process;

30 (4) identifying the capital investments needed to support  
31 physical plant, technology, and workforce development initiatives  
32 in nursing homes; and

33 (5)<sup>1</sup> broader reforms to the long-term system of care, including  
34 developing technology requirements to enable enhanced use of  
35 telemedicine and telehealth, instituting workforce engagement and  
36 advancement models including career laddering options and  
37 structures, increasing the use of Medicaid managed care to drive  
38 improvements in quality and oversight of nursing homes, and  
39 establishing acuity adjustments for Medicaid managed care  
40 payments to nursing homes.

41 b. The task force shall comprise <sup>1</sup>**[21]** 27<sup>1</sup> members as  
42 follows:

43 (1) the Commissioner of Health, the Commissioner of Human  
44 Services, <sup>1</sup>the Commissioner of Military and Veterans' Affairs,<sup>1</sup>

2 designees, who shall serve ex officio;

4 Governor, which public members shall include at least one member  
5 representing each of the following<sup>1</sup>, with at least two members  
6 being from urban communities<sup>1</sup>: a non-profit nursing home; <sup>1</sup>a for-

17 nursing home; a medical director for a non-profit nursing home; a  
18 certified nurse assistant; an advocate for worker safety in long-term

24 Speaker of the General Assembly, which public members shall  
25 include at least one member representing each of the following: ~~1~~**1**~~【a~~  
26 ~~non-profit long-term care facility】~~ an adult day care center<sup>1</sup>; a  
27 ~~1~~**1**~~【medical director for a for-profit nursing】~~<sup>1</sup> home <sup>1</sup>health agency; a

33 c. The members of the task force shall be appointed, and the  
34 task force shall organize, no later than 45 days after the effective  
35 date of ~~1~~**1**~~【P.L. , c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as~~  
36 ~~this bill)】~~ this act<sup>1</sup>. The members shall select a chairperson and a  
37 vice-chairperson from among the public members. The chairperson  
38 may appoint a secretary to the task force, who need not be a  
39 member of the task force. The task force shall meet at the call of  
40 the chairperson.

41 d. Members of the task force shall serve without compensation,  
42 but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenditures incurred in the  
43 performance of their duties as members of the task force, within the  
44 limits of funds appropriated or otherwise made available to the task  
45 force for its purposes.

1 e. The Department of Health shall provide administrative and  
2 staff support to the task force. The task force shall be entitled to  
3 call to its assistance and avail itself of the services of the employees  
4 of any State, county, or municipal department, board, bureau,  
5 commission, or agency as it may require and as may be available  
6 for its purposes.

7 f. No later than one year after its organization, the task force  
8 shall prepare and submit a report to the Governor and, pursuant to  
9 section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), to the Legislature,  
10 concerning its recommendations developed pursuant to this section.  
11 The task force shall dissolve 30 days following the date on which it  
12 submits its report under this subsection.

14 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire 30  
15 days after the date the task force submits its report pursuant to  
16 subsection f. of section 1 of this act.
