### SYNOPSIS

Permits raffles to be conducted remotely at large sporting venues.

## **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As introduced.



1 AN ACT permitting raffles to be conducted remotely at large 2 sporting venues and amending P.L.2018, c.79. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 1 of P.L.2018, c.79 (C.5:8-51.6) is amended to read 8 as follows: 9 1. a. It shall be lawful for an organization eligible to conduct 10 raffles in accordance with section 2 of P.L.1954, c.5 (C.5:8-51) and registered and licensed with the Legalized Games of Chance 11 12 Control Commission to conduct, whether in person or remotely, raffles in a large sporting venue located in a municipality where the 13 provisions of the "Raffles Licensing Law," P.L.1954, c.5 (C.5:8-50 14 15 et seq.), are operative, provided that all other requirements to 16 conduct raffles are met. To the extent any conflict exists between 17 this act, P.L.2018, c.79 (C.5:8-51.6), and the "Raffles Licensing 18 Law," P.L.1954, c.5 (C.5:8-50 et seq.), then the provisions set forth 19 in this act shall govern. 20 For the purposes of this section, the conduct of the raffle 21 remotely using the Internet or other electronic means shall be 22 deemed to be the conduct of the raffle at the large sporting venue, 23 and shall be deemed to take place only thereat, regardless of any 24 participant's physical location within this State, provided the 25 personnel of the organization conducting the raffle, whether or not 26 through a third-party vendor, is located in the venue at the time of 27 the sale and drawing of any ticket. An organization conducting a raffle at a large sporting venue is 28 29 subject to the following requirements: 30 (1) The organization conducting the raffle, in conjunction with 31 the large sporting venue, shall announce the winner or winners of a 32 raffle [during] on the date on which the [ticketed] event [in] with 33 which the raffle is [occurring] associated occurs. The organization

34 [and the large sporting venue] shall post each winning raffle ticket 35 number on [their respective websites] its website, if such [websites 36 have] website has been established, on the same date as the 37 announcement, which number shall be posted for one year or until 38 each winner claims the prize and submits any required 39 documentation. Any prize from a raffle shall be delivered to a 40 claimant verified to have the winning ticket within 30 days of the 41 [event in which the raffle took place] <u>announcement</u>; however, if 42 no claimant verified to have the winning ticket claims the prize and 43 signs all reasonably necessary documentation within 30 days of the 44 event at which the raffle took place, the organization conducting the 45 raffle [at a large sporting venue] shall hold the proceeds for a

period of one year from the date of the raffle. If no claimant with the winning raffle ticket claims the prize and has signed all reasonably necessary documentation within one year from the date of the drawing, then the prize shall be forfeited and shall revert back to the organization for its own authorized use.

6 (2) Any daily and annual limits on the value of prizes contained 7 in existing law or regulation shall not apply to raffles conducted [at 8 large sporting venues] in accordance with this act, P.L.2018, c.79 9 (C.5:8-51.6).

10 (3) On a quarterly basis in accordance with a schedule 11 established by the commission, an organization conducting raffles [in a large sporting venue] in accordance with this act, 12 13 P.L.2018, c.79 (C.5:8-51.6), shall furnish to the control commission 14 a duly verified statement showing the amount of the gross receipts 15 derived from each raffle held, operated, or conducted in the 16 preceding quarter, which shall include receipts from the sale of 17 shares, tickets, or rights in any manner connected with participation 18 in the raffle or the right to participate therein, each item of expense 19 incurred or paid, and each item of expenditure made or to be made, 20 name and address of each person to whom each such item has been 21 or is to be paid, with a detailed description of the merchandise 22 purchased or the services rendered therefor, the net proceeds 23 derived from each such raffle, and the uses to which such net 24 proceeds have been or are to be applied and a list of prizes offered 25 or given, with the respective values thereof and it shall be the duty 26 of each organization to maintain and keep such books and records 27 as may be necessary to substantiate the particulars of each such 28 report.

(4) An organization shall not conduct a raffle remotely unless
 the organization has received written approval from and is operating
 the raffle in conjunction with the large sporting venue.

32 b. Notwithstanding section 9 of P.L.1954, c.5 (C.5:8-58), an 33 organization conducting raffles at a large sporting venue may conduct raffles on Sunday. Alcohol may be served at the sporting 34 35 venue during the conduct of raffles provided that the sporting venue 36 is the holder of a sporting facility license in accordance with 37 R.S.33:1-12, or other appropriate license, to serve alcohol at retail 38 for consumption on the premises by the glass or other open 39 receptacle or in original containers. An organization conducting 40 raffles at a large sporting venue is not required to conduct the 41 drawings openly and in plain view of all players present.

c. Tickets for raffles conducted at a large sporting venue may
be sold [only by in-person transactions within the geographic area
of the large sporting venue] electronically or by the issuance of
paper tickets, and, when in person, through devices operated or
kiosks staffed by individuals who are employed by or represent the
organization conducting the raffle. Tickets for raffles may not be

1 purchased electronically by the public other than through [in-2 person] transactions with the personnel of the organization 3 conducting the raffle, whether or not such transaction is completed 4 through a third-party vendor. [In-person transactions] Transactions 5 between the purchaser and individuals who are employed by or 6 otherwise represent the organization conducting the raffle may be 7 made by cash, credit card, or other electronic payment methods, 8 including, but not limited to, the utilization of Internet or intranet 9 access (Wi-Fi or cellular connectivity) [in the large sporting 10 venue]. The sale and purchase of tickets remotely using the Internet or other electronic means shall be deemed to take place only at the 11 12 large sporting venue regardless of a purchaser's physical location 13 within this State, provided the personnel of the organization 14 conducting the raffle, whether or not through a third-party vendor, 15 is located in the venue at the time of sale. An organization 16 conducting a raffle remotely using the Internet or other electronic 17 means shall sell tickets only to persons physically located in this 18 State. Tickets for raffles conducted in accordance with this act, 19 P.L.2018, c.79 (C.5:8-51.6), shall not be subject to any ticket price 20 limits set for the general conduct of raffles. Pre-set bundles of 21 tickets may be sold at a discount to participants.

22 d. Pursuant to P.L.2018, c.79 (C.5:8-51.6) and notwithstanding 23 the provisions of subsection b. of section 2 of P.L.1954, c.5 (C.5:8-24 51), a 50-50 raffle shall have the raffle's net proceeds divided 25 between the raffle winner and the organization conducting the raffle 26 as a prize, and the prize may be awarded to a single participant or 27 may be divided between a pre-determined number of participants. 28 If the prize is to be divided between more than one participant, 29 potential participants shall be made aware of such a division. No 30 more than one 50-50 raffle as described in this subsection shall be 31 conducted during a ticketed event.

32 An organization conducting a raffle at a large sporting venue e. 33 may sell only traditional paper tickets, may use only electronic 34 raffle systems, may use only the Internet or other electronic means, 35 including software applications, or may use a combination of paper 36 and electronic raffle systems. Drawings for all raffles may be 37 conducted either by a traditional drawing of duplicate paper tickets 38 or electronically, with the winner or winners selected by electronic 39 means. For raffles conducted in paper form where winners are 40 chosen electronically or in combination of paper and electronic 41 raffle systems, the paper tickets shall be entered into the electronic 42 raffle system for record-keeping and for drawing purposes so that 43 the purchases of paper tickets have an equal chance of winning as 44 the purchases of electronic rights.

f. Notwithstanding the provisions of P.L.1954, c.5 (C.5:8-50 et
seq.), or any other law, rule, or regulation to the contrary, an
organization conducting a raffle at a large sporting venue shall be

1 permitted to deduct from gross revenues its reasonable costs and 2 expenses of conducting the raffle. 3 g. The commission shall promulgate, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et 4 5 seq.), rules and regulations governing the conduct of raffles 6 remotely using the Internet or other electronic means in accordance 7 with the provisions of this section. 8 <u>h.</u> As used in this section [,] : 9 ["electronic] <u>"Electronic</u> raffle systems" means hardware, 10 software, including software applications, internet, cellular, or Wi-11 Fi connected devices and associated devices that enable raffles to be 12 conducted entirely by electronic means, with rights to participate 13 sold electronically by individuals who are employed by or 14 otherwise represent the organization conducting the raffle, that 15 generate a unique electronic entry to the raffle that is the equivalent 16 of a paper ticket, each an electronic ticket which may be delivered 17 to the purchaser electronically, at the point of sale on the premises 18 of the large sporting venue recorded in the electronic raffle system 19 as eligible entries or rights to participate, and winners determined 20 by random drawing from all electronic entries or rights to 21 participate[; 22 "large]. "Internet or other electronic means" shall not include 23 electronic raffle systems. 24 "Large sporting venue" means a stadium, arena, or similar venue 25 with minimum seating for 8,000 spectators wherein professional, 26 semi-professional, or collegiate athletes compete in sports or other 27 athletic games and including the parking lots adjacent to and 28 serving the patrons of that venue **[**; and "net] . "Net proceeds" means the gross income from the sale of 29 30 tickets or rights to participate in a raffle, less only such actual 31 expenses incurred as are authorized in the "Raffles Licensing Law," 32 P.L.1954, c.5 (C.5:8-50 et seq.), and by the commission. 33 (cf: P.L.2018, c.79, s.1) 34 35 2. An organization eligible to conduct raffles in accordance 36 with section 2 of P.L.1954, c.5 (C.5:8-51) and registered and 37 licensed with the Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission 38 may conduct raffles remotely using the Internet or other electronic 39 means, including mobile, tablet, or other software applications, on 40 or after the date of enactment of this act, P.L. , c. (pending 41 before the Legislature as this bill), but prior to the adoption of the 42 rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to subsection g. thereof, 43 provided the organization is able to ensure, to the greatest extent 44 possible, the fairness, integrity, and security of the conduct of the 45 raffle and the security of the method of receipt of payment for any raffle ticket sale. 46 47 48 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### STATEMENT

This bill permits raffles to be conducted remotely at large sporting venues. Under current law, an organization otherwise eligible to conduct raffles may conduct a raffle at a large sporting venue, but the tickets may be sold only through in-person transactions.

8 This bill would permit tickets to be sold and raffles to be 9 conducted remotely, using the Internet or other electronic means, 10 including mobile or tablet applications. The conduct of the raffle 11 and the sale and purchase of tickets remotely using the Internet or 12 other electronic means will be deemed to take place at, and only at, the large sporting venue regardless of a participant's physical 13 14 location within this State, as long as personnel from the 15 organization are located in the venue at the time of the drawing and the time of sale. An organization conducting a raffle remotely using 16 17 the Internet or other electronic means may sell tickets only to 18 persons physically located in this State.

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
