SYNOPSIS

Requires electric public utilities to provide priority service restoration to age-restricted communities after major events.

1 AN ACT concerning the prioritization of electric public utility
2 service restoration after a major event and supplementing Title
3 48 of the Revised Statutes.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
6 of New Jersey:

8 1. As used in P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the
9 Legislature as this bill):

10 "Age-restricted community" means a planned real estate
11 development, as defined in section 3 of P.L.1977, c.419 (C.45:22A-
12 23), consisting of dwelling units governed by a common set of
13 rules, regulations, or restrictions intended and operated for persons
14 55 years of age or older.

15 "Board" means the Board of Public Utilities or any successor
16 agency.

17 "Electric public utility" or "utility" means a public utility, as that
18 term is defined in R.S.48:2-13, that provides electric distribution
19 service in this State.

20 "Major event" means an occurrence arising from conditions
21 beyond the control of an electric public utility that affect the
22 operation of a utility's distribution or transmission system,
23 including, but not limited to, a thunderstorm, tornado, hurricane,
24 flood, heat wave, snow storm, ice storm, earthquake, terrorist
25 attack, or any other condition that the board determines, which
26 results in:

27 a. a sustained interruption of electric public utility service to at
28 least 10 percent of the customers in an operating area or 10 percent
29 of a utility's customers within a municipality or county located in
30 an operating area; or

31 b. the declaration of a state of emergency or disaster by the
32 State or by the federal government.

33 "Sustained interruption" means the cessation of electric public
34 utility service to one or more customers lasting more than 48
35 consecutive hours after the conclusion of a major event where the
36 utility service cessation was caused by that major event.

38 2. a. The board shall adopt, pursuant to the "Administrative
39 Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), rules and
40 regulations requiring an electric public utility to give priority, when
41 possible, to an age-restricted community for utility service
42 restoration after a sustained interruption following a major event,
43 except that utility service restoration efforts to an age-restricted
44 community shall not divert efforts to restore utility service where
45 needed to otherwise maintain overall public safety. The rules and
46 regulations shall require a utility to request from every residential
47 customer, on an annual basis, information as to whether the
48 residential customer's address is located within an age-restricted

1 community. If a residential customer responds to the utility's
2 request for that information in the affirmative, the utility shall
3 designate that residential customer as eligible for priority utility
4 service restoration.

5 b. The rules and regulations adopted by the board pursuant to
6 subsection a. of this section shall allow an electric public utility to
7 exercise its discretion to prioritize service restoration to an age-
8 restricted community after a major event resulting in a sustained
9 interruption in accordance with the an age-restricted community's
10 needs and with the characteristics of the geographic area in which
11 utility service shall be restored.

13 3. This act shall take effect on the 60th day after the date of
14 enactment, but the Board of Public Utilities may take any
15 anticipatory administrative action in advance thereof as shall be
16 necessary for the timely implementation of P.L. , c. (C.)
17 (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

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20 STATEMENT

22 This bill requires the Board of Public Utilities (BPU) to adopt
23 rules and regulations requiring an electric public utility (utility) to
24 provide priority utility service restoration, when possible, following
25 a major event resulting in a sustained interruption of utility service
26 to an age-restricted community. The bill requires the BPU to allow
27 a utility to exercise its discretion to prioritize utility service
28 restoration to an age-restricted community after a major event
29 resulting in a sustained interruption of utility service in accordance
30 with the an age-restricted community's needs and the characteristics
31 of the geographic area in which that service is to be restored.

32 The bill requires a utility to request from every residential
33 customer, on an annual basis, information as to whether the
34 residential customer's address is located within an age-restricted
35 community. If a residential customer responds to the utility's
36 request for that information in the affirmative, the utility is to
37 designate that residential customer as eligible for priority utility
38 service restoration.

39 Any priority utility service restoration efforts to an age-restricted
40 community is not to divert efforts to restore utility service where
41 needed to otherwise maintain overall public safety.
