SYNOPSIS

Establishes requirements for optometrists to be authorized to administer immunizations.

1 AN ACT concerning optometrists, amending R.S.45:12-1, and 2 supplementing chapter 12 of Title 45 of the Revised Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. R.S.45:12-1 is amended to read as follows: 8 45:12-1. Optometry is hereby declared to be a profession, and 9 the practice of optometry is defined to be the employment of 10 objective or subjective means, or both, for the examination of the 11 human eye and adnexae for the purposes of ascertaining any 12 departure from the normal, measuring its powers of vision and 13 adapting lenses or prisms for the aid thereof, or the use and 14 prescription of pharmaceutical agents, excluding injections, except 15 for injections to counter anaphylactic reaction [;], and excluding controlled dangerous substances as provided in sections 5 and 6 of 16 17 P.L.1970, c.226 (C.24:21-5 and C.24:21-6), except as otherwise 18 authorized by section 9 of P.L.1991, c.385 (C.45:12-9.11), for the 19 purposes of treating deficiencies, deformities, diseases, or 20 abnormalities of the human eye and adnexae, including the removal 21 of superficial foreign bodies from the eye and adnexae. The 22 practice of optometry shall include the administration of 23 immunizations by any route or modality, provided that administration of the immunization is consistent with 24 25 recommendations issued by the Advisory Committee for 26 Immunization Practices in the federal Centers for Disease Control 27 and Prevention and complies with the requirements of section 2 of 28 P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). 29 An optometrist utilizing pharmaceutical agents for the purposes

of treatment of ocular conditions and diseases shall be held to a
standard of patient care in the use of such agents commensurate to
that of a physician utilizing pharmaceutical agents for treatment
purposes.

34 A person shall be deemed to be practicing optometry within the 35 meaning of this chapter who in any way advertises himself as an 36 optometrist, or who shall employ any means for the measurement of 37 the powers of vision or the adaptation of lenses or prisms for the aid 38 thereof, practice, offer or attempt to practice optometry as herein 39 defined, either on his own behalf or as an employee or student of 40 another, whether under the personal supervision of his employer or 41 perceptor or not, or to use testing appliances for the purposes of 42 measurement of the powers of vision or diagnose any ocular 43 deficiency or deformity, visual or muscular anomaly of the human 44 eye and adnexae or prescribe lenses, prisms or ocular exercise for 45 the correction or the relief thereof, or who uses or prescribes

except upon certification from the New Jersey State Board of
Optometrists that the optometrist has met any training and
qualification requirements as are established by the board by rules
and regulations adopted pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure
Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.).

14 (2) The New Jersey State Board of Optometrists may certify an 15 optometrist to administer immunizations during a public health 16 emergency declared pursuant to the "Emergency Health Powers 17 Act," P.L.2005, c.222 (C.26:13-1 et seq.), regardless of whether the 18 board has adopted rules and regulations implementing the 19 provisions of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature 20 as this bill).

b. (1) An optometrist shall not administer an immunization to
any patient who is younger than 18 years of age unless
administration of the immunization to the patient is authorized by
the patient's parent or legal guardian.

(2) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (1) of this subsection,
an optometrist may administer the influenza immunization to any
patient who is seven years of age or older, and may administer any
immunization to any patient who is 10 years of age or older. An
optometrist shall not administer any immunization to a patient who
is younger than seven years of age.

c. An immunization administered to a patient by an optometrist
shall be reported by the optometrist to the New Jersey
Immunization Information System established pursuant to section 4
of P.L.2004, c.138 (C.26:4-134) for inclusion in the patient's
registry.

37 3. The New Jersey State Board of Optometrists shall adopt
38 rules and regulations, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure
39 Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), as shall be necessary to
40 implement the provisions of this act.

4. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

47 This bill establishes requirements to authorize optometrists to 48 administer immunizations. Specifically, an optometrist will be 4

authorized to administer an immunization by any route or modality
if the optometrist meets the training and qualification requirements
as are established by the New Jersey State Board of Optometry by
regulation, and administration of the immunization is consistent
with recommendations issued by the Advisory Committee for
Immunization Practices in the federal Centers for Disease Control
and Prevention.

8 Optometrists who meet these requirements will be authorized to 9 administer any immunization to a patient who is 10 years of age and 10 older, and will be permitted to administer the influenza 11 immunization to any patient who is seven years of age or older. 12 Optometrists will be prohibited from administering immunizations 13 to patients who are younger than seven years of age.

In the case of patients who are seven years of age or older but younger than 18 years of age, optometrists will be required to receive authorization from the patient's parent or legal guardian as a condition of administering an immunization to the patient.

18 The bill provides that optometrists may be authorized by the 19 New Jersey State Board of Optometrists to administer 20 immunizations during a public health emergency declared pursuant 21 to the "Emergency Health Powers Act," P.L.2005, c.222 (C.26:13-1 22 et seq.), regardless of whether the board has promulgated rules and 23 regulations implementing the provisions of the bill.

Any immunization administered to a patient by an optometrist is to be reported by the optometrist to the New Jersey Immunization Information System established pursuant to section 4 of P.L.2004,

c.138 (C.26:4-134) for inclusion in the patient's registry.
