SYNOPSIS

Requires DOH to establish Community Health Center Integrated Care Loan Program; appropriates funds for purposes of loan program.

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1 AN ACT concerning integrated health care at certain community 2 health centers, supplementing Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, 3 and making an appropriation. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. As used in the act, 9 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Health. 10 "Community health center" means a federally qualified health 11 center (FQHC), an ambulatory care facility, a certified community 12 behavioral health clinic (CCBHC), a behavioral health program, and a substance use disorder facility. 13 "Medicaid" means the Medicaid program established pursuant to 14 15 P.L.1968, c.413 (C.30:4D-1 et seq.). 16 17 2. a. The Commissioner of Health, in collaboration with the Commissioner of Human Services, shall establish the Community 18 Health Center Integrated Care Loan Program. The purpose of the 19 20 loan program shall be to provide zero percent interest, short-term financing loans to community health centers to support the 21 22 integration of the center's existing health services with an 23 additional modality of care. Eligible modalities of care under the 24 loan program shall include: primary care services, behavioral 25 health care services, and substance abuse disorder services. 26 b. A community health center that elects to participate in the 27 loan program shall submit an application to the commissioner on a 28 form and in a manner prescribed by the commissioner. The 29 application shall, at a minimum, require the center to provide the 30 following: 31 (1) a description of the existing health care services offered at 32 the center and of the new modality of care that will be integrated 33 within the center upon receipt of the loan; 34 (2) a requested loan amount, along with a corresponding budget 35 outlining how the funds will be expended to achieve integration of 36 the new modality of care; 37 (3) data which demonstrates that the center is in need a financial 38 resources to successfully provide an additional modality of care; 39 and 40 (4) information on the community health center's patient 41 population. 42 c. Upon receipt of an application, the commissioner shall review the application and, subject to evaluation and the availability 43 44 of funds appropriated to the Community Health Center Integrated 45 Care Loan Fund, established pursuant to section 2 of this act, award 46 a loan to each approved applicant within 30 days of the receipt of

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1 The commissioner, to the maximum extent an application. 2 practicable, shall equitably distribute loans to successful applicants 3 in the northern, central, and southern regions of the State. The commissioner shall give priority to centers that are located in areas 4 5 with a high Medicaid population, as determined by the commissioner. 6 7 d. Loan recipients shall use funds received pursuant to this act 8 for the following purposes associated with the integration of a new 9 modality of care: 10 (1) staff and training costs; 11 (2) licensure fees; 12 (3) infrastructure improvements required to comply with licensure requirements; and 13 (4) any other costs approved by the commissioner in the 14 application process. 15 16 17 3. a. The Community Health Center Integrated Care Loan 18 Fund is established as a nonlapsing, revolving fund, which shall be administered by the Department of Health. The fund shall be 19 20 credited with monies received from the General Fund, pursuant to section 4 of this act, as well as the federal government, private 21 22 foundations, or other sources, which may be available to support the 23 Community Health Center Integrated Care Loan Program. 24 b. The State Treasurer is the custodian of the fund, and all 25 disbursements from the fund shall be made by the State Treasurer 26 upon vouchers signed by the commissioner. The monies in the fund 27 shall be invested and reinvested by the Director of the Division of Investment in the Department of the Treasury as are other trust 28 29 funds in the custody of the State Treasurer in the manner provided 30 by law. Interest received on the monies in the fund shall be credited 31 to the fund. 32 33 4. There are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the 34 Community Health Center Integrated Care Loan Fund, established 35 pursuant to section 3 of this act, such sums as may be necessary for the implementation of this act, as determined by the Commissioner 36 37 of Health, in collaboration with the Commissioner of Human Services. 38 39 40 5. Pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), the Commissioner of Health, in 41 collaboration with the Commissioner of Human Services and the 42 State Treasurer, shall adopt rules and regulations to effectuate the 43 44 purposes of this act. 45

46 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

3 This bill requires the Commissioner of Health, in collaboration 4 with the Commissioner of Human Services, to establish the 5 Community Health Center Integrated Care Loan Program. The purpose of the loan program is to provide zero percent interest, 6 7 short-term financing loans to community health centers to support 8 the integration of the center's existing health services with an 9 additional modality of care. Under the bill, a "community health 10 center" means a federally qualified health center (FQHCs), an 11 ambulatory care facility, a certified community behavioral health 12 clinic (CCBHC), a behavioral health program, and a substance use 13 disorder facility. Eligible modalities of care include: primary care 14 services, behavioral health care services, and substance abuse 15 disorder services.

16 Research demonstrates that integrating physical and behavioral 17 health care services enhances access to services, improves quality of 18 care and patient outcomes, and lowers overall health care costs. 19 However, funding constraints often make the shift to integrated care 20 difficult for community health centers that lack the capital to make the 21 initial staffing and infrastructure investments needed to comply with 22 the additional licensure requirements. It is the sponsor's goal that this 23 loan program will provide the opportunity to the State's health care 24 providers, who serve the most vulnerable residents, to offer the 25 benefits of integrated care to their patients.

26 A community health center that elects to participate in the loan 27 program is required to submit an application to the commissioner on 28 a form and in a manner prescribed by the commissioner. The 29 application, at a minimum, is to require the center to provide the 30 following: 1) a description of the existing health care services 31 offered at the center and of the new modality of care that will be 32 integrated within the center upon receipt of the loan; 2) a requested 33 loan amount, along with a corresponding budget outlining how the 34 funds will be expended to achieve integration of the new modality 35 of care; 3) data which demonstrates that the center is in need a 36 financial resources to successfully provide an additional modality of 37 care; and 4) information on the community health center's patient 38 population.

39 Upon receipt of an application, the commissioner is to review the 40 application and, subject to evaluation and the availability of funds 41 in the Community Health Center Integrated Care Loan Fund, award 42 a loan to each approved applicant within 30 days of the receipt of 43 an application. The Community Health Center Integrated Care 44 Loan Fund is a non-lapsing revolving fund established under the 45 bill and credited with monies received from the General Fund as 46 well as any monies available from the federal government, private

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1 foundations, or other sources. The commissioner, to the maximum extent practicable, is required to equitably distribute loans to 2 3 successful applicants in the northern, central, and southern regions 4 of the State and give priority to centers that are located in areas with 5 a high Medicaid population, as determined by the commissioner. 6 Loan recipients are required to use the funds for the following 7 purposes associated with the integration of a new modality of care: 8 1) staff and training costs; 2) licensure fees; 3) infrastructure 9 improvements required to comply with licensure requirements; and 10 4) any other costs approved by the commissioner in the application

11 process.
