SYNOPSIS

Establishes pilot program to refer certain emergency department patients for development of coordinated behavioral health care treatment and support services plan.

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AN ACT concerning behavioral health care and supplementing Title
 26 and Title 30 of the Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. a. There is established in the Department of Human
Services a pilot program to develop coordinated, specialized
treatment plans for individuals with behavioral health issues,
including, but not limited to, mild-to-moderate mental health issues,
emotional disturbances, and substance use disorders.

12 The department shall select two hospitals in each Regional b. Health Hub designated pursuant to P.L.2019, c.517 (C.30:4D-8.16 13 14 et seq.) to participate in the pilot program. To the extent possible, 15 the department shall seek to select for participation in the pilot 16 program hospitals that are not currently affiliated with the Early 17 Intervention Support Services program and hospitals that are 18 connected with or demonstrate a plan to connect with the Regional 19 Health Hub's health information network as well as the New Jersey 20 Health Information Network.

21 c. Hospitals participating in the pilot program shall refer any 22 patient presenting at the hospital's emergency department with a 23 behavioral health issue, including, but not limited to, a mild-to-24 moderate mental health issue, emotional disturbance, or substance 25 use disorder, which behavioral health issue does not meet the 26 criteria for admission to inpatient care, to the Regional Health Hub 27 of which the hospital is a member. The regional Health Hub shall 28 evaluate the patient and develop a coordinated behavioral health 29 treatment plan for the patient, which plan shall identify wraparound 30 support services appropriate to the patient's treatment needs.

d. Each designated Regional Health Hub shall provide
administrative and support services to member hospitals
participating in the pilot program to refer patients to the Regional
Health Hub for the development of a coordinated behavioral health
treatment plan. Each Regional Health Hub shall develop protocols
for use by the Regional Health Hub and hospitals participating in
the pilot program, which protocols shall:

This act shall take effect immediately. 22 23 **STATEMENT** 26 This bill establishes a pilot program in the Department of Human 27 Services (DHS) to develop coordinated, specialized treatment plans for individuals with behavioral health issues, including, but not 28 29 limited to, mild-to-moderate mental health issues, emotional 30 disturbances, and substance use disorders. The DHS will be required to select two hospitals in each 31 32 Regional Health Hub designated pursuant to P.L.2019, c.517 33 (C.30:4D-8.16 et seq.) to participate in the pilot program. To the 34 extent possible, the DHS is to select for participation in the pilot 35 program hospitals that are not currently affiliated with the Early Intervention Support Services program and hospitals that are 36 37 connected with or demonstrate a plan to connect with the Regional 38 Health Hub's health information network as well as the New Jersey 39 Health Information Network. 40 Hospitals participating in the pilot program will be required to 41 refer any patient presenting at the hospital's emergency department with a behavioral health issue, including, but not limited to, a mild-42 43 to-moderate mental health issue, emotional disturbance, or 44 substance use disorder, which behavioral health issue does not meet 45 the criteria for admission to inpatient care, to the Regional Health 46 Hub of which the hospital is a member. Each designated Regional Health Hub will be required to provide administrative and support services to member hospitals participating in the pilot program to refer patients to the Regional Health Hub for the development of a coordinated behavioral health treatment plan. Regional Health Hubs will be required to develop protocols for use by the Regional Health Hub and hospitals participating in the pilot program, which protocols are to:

10 (1) be designed to ensure that patients referred to the Regional 11 Health Hub under the pilot program are provided timely referrals to 12 behavioral health treatment and support services appropriate to the 13 patient's behavioral health and related wraparound social services 14 needs, including, but not limited to, the Early Intervention Support 15 Services program, medication-assisted treatment, cash assistance 16 programs, housing assistance programs, and other appropriate 17 services as may be available and as are consistent with the patient's 18 coordinated behavioral health treatment plan; and

To the extent possible, Regional Health Hubs providing referrals under the bill in connection with a behavioral health treatment plan to a patient who is enrolled in the State Medicaid program are to seek to ensure that all such referrals are made to authorized Medicaid providers.

The Commissioner of Human Services will be required to apply for such State plan amendments or waivers as may be necessary to implement the provisions of the bill and to secure federal financial participation for State Medicaid expenditures under the federal Medicaid program in connection with the development of coordinated behavioral health treatment plans pursuant to the bill.
