1 AN ACT concerning the inclusion of agricultural concerns in the 2 annual transportation capital project list and supplementing Title 3 27 of the Revised Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. a. The Department of Transportation shall annually consult, 9 in a manner to be determined by the Commissioner of 10 Transportation, with the Department of Agriculture and County 11 Agriculture Development Boards, established pursuant to section 7 12 of P.L.1983, c.32 (C.4:1C-14) concerning the transportation 13 infrastructure needs of the State's agricultural community when 14 developing the Annual Transportation Capital Program, required 15 pursuant to section 22 of P.L1984, c.73 (C.27:1B-22). 16 The Department of Transportation shall develop a b. 17 methodology to account for the identified transportation 18 infrastructure needs of the agricultural community and incorporate those needs into the Department of Transportation's infrastructure 19 20 management systems that are used to evaluate transportation 21 infrastructure needs, when identifying potential transportation 22 infrastructure projects for inclusion in the Annual Transportation 23 Capital Program. 24 25 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 26 27 **STATEMENT** 28 29 30 This bill requires the Department of Transportation (DOT) to 31 consult with the Department of Agriculture (DOA) and County 32 Agriculture Development Boards (county boards) when developing 33 the Annual Transportation Capital Program. The bill requires the 34 DOT to develop a methodology to account for the transportation 35 infrastructure needs identified by the DOA and county boards, and to incorporate those needs into DOT management systems, the 36 37 analytic tools used to evaluate the condition of transportation 38 infrastructure, when identifying infrastructure projects for inclusion 39 in the Annual Transportation Capital Program. 40 The State has made significant investments into farmland 41 preservation efforts. Additional investments must be made into the 42 transportation infrastructure surrounding such farmland to preserve the productivity and viability of New Jersey farms. Investments in 43 44 transportation infrastructure that benefits agriculture will help 45 maintain farming as a viable industry in the State and provide net 46 benefits to the economy as a whole.
