The amount hereinabove appropriated for Coronavirus Relief Fund 14 15 - Assistance to Microbusinesses, EDA shall be allocated from a portion of federal block grant funds allocated to the State from 16 17 the federal "Coronavirus Relief Fund" established pursuant to the federal "Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act 18 19 (CARES Act)," Pub.L.116-136, or any other federal funds made 20 available to the State in response to the coronavirus disease 2019 21 (COVID-19) pandemic. 22

23 The amount hereinabove appropriated for Coronavirus Relief Fund 24 -Assistance to Microbusinesses, EDA shall be allocated by the 25 New Jersey Economic Development Authority to entities located in 26 the State that produce goods or provide services and have 10 or 27 fewer full-time equivalent employees. The New Jersey Economic Development Authority shall establish minimum grant eligibility 28 29 criteria and the size of the grant awards to meet the needs of the grantee entities in responding to the public health crisis. \mathbf{J}^1 30

Subject to the availability of federal funds provided or</u> 2 made accessible to the State via federal block grant funds allocated 3 to the State from the federal "Coronavirus Relief Fund" established 4 pursuant to the federal "Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act)," Pub.L.116-136, or any other federal 5 funds made available to the State in response to the coronavirus 6 7 disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, \$25,000,000 from such 8 federal funds shall be made available to the New Jersey Economic 9 Development Authority for the purposes set forth in subsection b. of 10 this section. b. The funds made available to the New Jersey Economic 11 12 Development Authority pursuant to subsection a. of this section 13 shall be reserved by the authority to provide financial support, by 14 way of grants to eligible microbusinesses. 15 c. The New Jersey Economic Development Authority shall establish the size of the awards and eligibility of entities in 16 17 subsection b. of this section to meet the needs of the 18 microbusinesses in responding to the public health crisis. 19 d.
