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30 The amount hereinabove appropriated for Assistance to Food and Beverage Establishments, EDA, is conditioned upon the 31 32 submission of a report by the Chief Executive Officer of the New Jersey Economic Development Authority to the Governor and 33 34 the Legislature, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 35 (C.52:14-19.1), detailing the expenditure of program funds. At a minimum, the report shall indicate the number of food and 36 37 beverage establishments that applied for financial assistance; the

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1 number of food and beverage establishments that received 2 financial assistance; the amount of financial assistance provided to each recipient; and a brief description of each recipient. 3 4 5 Of the amounts appropriated to the New Jersey Economic Development Authority for Assistance to Food and Beverage 6 7 Establishments, Assistance to Businesses and Nonprofits, 8 Child Care Providers, Assistance Assistance to to Microbusinesses, the Sustain and Serve NJ Program, and the 9 10 Startup Business and Nonprofit Assistance Program, the 11 authority may retain not more than \$1,000,000 to defray 12 administrative expenses. 13 14 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 15 16 17 **STATEMENT** 18 19 This bill appropriates \$20 million from the General Fund to the 20 New Jersey Economic Development Authority (EDA) to support food and beverage establishments impacted by the COVID-19 21 22 pandemic. 23 In April 2021, the State enacted P.L.2021, c.45 to provide \$35 24 million in federal funding to the EDA for disbursement to eligible 25 food and beverage establishments impacted by the COVID-19 26 pandemic. This bill provides \$20 million in additional State 27 funding to support this program. As permitted under P.L.2021, c.45, the bill allows the EDA to transfer uncommitted funds to other 28 29 programs administered by the authority to address the impact of the 30 COVID-19 pandemic. The bill also allows a portion of these funds 31 to be used for administrative expenses. As a condition of receiving State funds, the bill also requires the 32 33 EDA to submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature detailing the expenditure of program funds. At a minimum, the 34 35 report would be required to indicate the number of food and beverage establishments that applied for financial assistance; the 36 37 number of food and beverage establishments that received financial 38 assistance; the amount of financial assistance provided to each 39 recipient; and a brief description of each recipient.
