## **SYNOPSIS**

Prohibits municipal ordinances from requiring license tag to use bicycles within municipality.

1 AN ACT concerning ordinances regulating the use of bicycles in a 2 municipality and supplementing Title 40 of the Revised Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. a. The governing body of a municipality shall not adopt or 8 enforce any ordinance or resolution, which within the municipality 9 authorizes the issuance of a license tag, or requires possession of 10 such a tag, for: (1) riding a bicycle; (2) operating a bicycle; (3) 11 propelling a bicycle; (4) renting a bicycle; (5) owning a bicycle; or 12 (6) buying and selling a bicycle. 13 b. Any ordinance adopted by the governing body of a municipality in violation of subsection a. of this section shall be 14 15 null and void. 16 c. As used in this section, "bicycle" means a vehicle with two 17 wheels propelled solely by human power and having pedals, handle 18 bars and a saddle-like seat. The term shall include a bicycle for two or more persons having seats and corresponding sets of pedals 19 20 arranged in tandem. 21 22 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 23 24 25 **STATEMENT** 26 27 This bill prohibits municipalities from adopting or enforcing ordinances or resolutions which would authorize the issuance of 28 29 license tags for using a bicycle and thereby requiring license tags to 30 use a bicycle within a municipality. Specifically, this bill prohibits a municipality from adopting or 31 enforcing any ordinance or resolution, which within the 32 33 municipality authorizes the issuance of a license tag, or requires 34 possession of such a tag, for: (1) riding a bicycle; (2) operating a bicycle; (3) propelling a bicycle; (4) renting a bicycle; (5) owning a 35 bicycle; or (6) buying and selling a bicycle. 36 37 Additionally, municipal ordinances or resolutions adopted by the 38 governing body of a municipality in violation of the bill would be

39 considered null and void.
