SYNOPSIS

Requires law enforcement agencies to establish review council in internal affairs unit to investigate law enforcement officers who participate in hate groups.

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7	1. Section 10 of P.L.1996, c.115 (C.40A:14-181) is amended to

9	10. <u>a.</u> Every law enforcement agency, including a police
10	department of an institution of higher education established
11	pursuant to P.L.1970, c.211 (C.18A:6-4.2 et seq.), shall adopt and
12	implement guidelines which shall be consistent with the guidelines
13	governing the "Internal Affairs Policy and Procedures" of the Police
14	Management Manual promulgated by the Police Bureau of the
15	Division of Criminal Justice in the Department of Law and Public
16	Safety, and shall be consistent with any tenure or civil service
17	laws, and shall not supersede any existing contractual agreements.
18	b. The "Internal Affairs Policy and Procedures" of the Police
19	Management Manual shall require that the internal affairs unit or
20	function of each law enforcement agency in this State to establish
21	an extremist review council. The council shall investigate official
22	misconduct complaints alleging that a law enforcement officer
23	engaged in misconduct while on or off duty by making public
24	expressions of hate, participating in hate groups activities, or being
25	a member of a hate group.
26	As used in this subsection,
27	"Hate group" means an organization that supports, advocates for,
28	threatens, or practices genocide or violence toward any group of
29	persons based on their race, ethnicity, nationality, religion, gender,
30	gender identity, sexual orientation, or disability.
31	"Public expression of hate" means an explicit expression made in
32	writing or speech by a law enforcement officer while on or off duty
33	in a public forum, including, but not limited to, social media in a
34	public or private discussion forum to advocate for, support, or
35	threaten the genocide or violence toward any group of persons
36	based on their race, ethnicity, nationality, religion, gender, gender

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2. This act shall take effect on the first day of the fourth month next following the date of enactment but the Attorney General may take any anticipatory action in advance thereof as shall be necessary for the implementation of this act.
