#### **SYNOPSIS**

Requires Adjutant General of DMVA send weekly reports to Commissioner of DOH on status of veterans' homes in State during every future public health emergency; requires such reports through December 31, 2021.

1 AN ACT concerning reports on the status of the veterans' homes in this State during a public health emergency <sup>1</sup> and through 2 December 31, 2021<sup>1</sup>, and supplementing Title 38A of the New 3 4 Jersey Statutes. 5 6 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 7 of New Jersey: 8 9 Notwithstanding the provisions of any law, rule, or 1. a. 10 regulation to the contrary, the Adjutant General of the Department 11 of Military and Veterans' Affairs shall transmit a weekly report on 12 the status of the State veterans' homes to the Commissioner of the Department of Health whenever a Public Health Emergency, 13 14 pursuant to the "Emergency Health Powers Act," P.L.2005, c.222 15 (C.26:13-1 et seq.), has been declared by the Governor and is in 16 effect. The weekly report shall include: 17 (1) the number of residents and staff in each veterans' home, including comparisons to previous reports; 18 19 (2) any significant health risks posed to the residents and staff in 20 each veterans' home due to the public health emergency; 21 (3) any changes in operating procedures in each veterans' home 22 due to the public health emergency; and 23 (4) the amount of personal protective equipment available to 24 residents and staff at each veterans' home. 25 b. As used in this section: (1) "veterans' home" means the New Jersey Veterans' Memorial 26 Home - Menlo Park, the New Jersey Veterans' Memorial Home -27 28 Vineland, and the New Jersey Veterans' Memorial Home - Paramus. 29 (2) "personal protective equipment" means any items commonly 30 used to protect an individual from bacterial or viral infections, 31 including, but not limited to, disinfecting wipes, disposable gloves, 32 disposable gowns, face shields, N95 face masks, surgical masks, or parts thereof. 33 34 35 <sup>1</sup>2. The Adjutant General of the Department of Military and 36 Veterans' Affairs shall also transmit the weekly report on the status of the State veterans' homes to the Commissioner of the 37 Department of Health required under section 1 of this act, P.L., c. 38 (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), during the period 39 40 beginning on the seventh day following the effective date of this act 41 and ending on December 31, 2021.<sup>1</sup> 42 43 <sup>1</sup>[2.] 3.<sup>1</sup> This act shall take effect immediately.
