SYNOPSIS

Amends State Constitution to permit sports wagering through casinos and current or former horse racetracks on any collegiate athletic competitions.

1 A **CONCURRENT RESOLUTION** proposing to amend Article IV,
2 Section VII, paragraph 2 of the Constitution of the State of New
3 Jersey.

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5 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the General Assembly of the State of New
6 Jersey (the Senate concurring):

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8 1. The following proposed amendment to the Constitution of the
9 State of New Jersey is agreed to:

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PROPOSED AMENDMENT

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13 Amend Article IV, Section VII, paragraph 2 to read as follows:

14 2. No gambling of any kind shall be authorized by the
15 Legislature unless the specific kind, restrictions and control thereof
16 have been heretofore submitted to, and authorized by a majority of
17 the votes cast by, the people at a special election or shall hereafter be
18 submitted to, and authorized by a majority of the votes cast thereon
19 by, the legally qualified voters of the State voting at a general
20 election, except that, without any such submission or authorization:

21 A. It shall be lawful for bona fide veterans, charitable,
22 educational, religious or fraternal organizations, civic and service
23 clubs, senior citizen associations or clubs, volunteer fire companies
24 and first-aid or rescue squads to conduct, under such restrictions and
25 control as shall from time to time be prescribed by the Legislature by
26 law, games of chance of, and restricted to, the selling of rights to
27 participate, the awarding of prizes, in the specific kind of game of
28 chance sometimes known as bingo or lotto, played with cards bearing
29 numbers or other designations, 5 or more in one line, the holder
30 covering numbers as objects, similarly numbered, are drawn from a
31 receptacle and the game being won by the person who first covers a
32 previously designated arrangement of numbers on such a card, when
33 the entire net proceeds of such games of chance are to be devoted to
34 educational, charitable, patriotic, religious or public-spirited uses,
35 and in the case of bona fide veterans' organizations and senior citizen
36 associations or clubs to the support of such organizations, in any
37 municipality, in which a majority of the qualified voters, voting
38 thereon, at a general or special election as the submission thereof
39 shall be prescribed by the Legislature by law, shall authorize the
40 conduct of such games of chance therein;

41 B. It shall be lawful for the Legislature to authorize, by law, bona
42 fide veterans, charitable, educational, religious or fraternal
43 organizations, civic and service clubs, senior citizen associations or
44 clubs, volunteer fire companies and first-aid or rescue squads to
45 conduct games of chance of, and restricted to, the selling of rights to

1 participate, and the awarding of prizes, in the specific kinds of games
2 of chance sometimes known as raffles, conducted by the drawing for
3 prizes or by the allotment of prizes by chance, when the entire net
4 proceeds of such games of chance are to be devoted to educational,
5 charitable, patriotic, religious or public-spirited uses, and in the case
6 of bona fide veterans' organizations and senior citizen associations or
7 clubs to the support of such organizations, in any municipality, in
8 which such law shall be adopted by a majority of the qualified voters,
9 voting thereon, at a general or special election as the submission
10 thereof shall be prescribed by law and for the Legislature, from time
11 to time, to restrict and control, by law, the conduct of such games of
12 chance;

13 C. It shall be lawful for the Legislature to authorize the conduct
14 of State lotteries restricted to the selling of rights to participate
15 therein and the awarding of prizes by drawings when the entire net
16 proceeds of any such lottery shall be for State institutions and State
17 aid for education; provided, however, that it shall not be competent
18 for the Legislature to borrow, appropriate or use, under any pretense
19 whatsoever, lottery net proceeds for the confinement, housing,
20 supervision or treatment of, or education programs for, adult criminal
21 offenders or juveniles adjudged delinquent or for the construction,
22 staffing, support, maintenance or operation of an adult or juvenile
23 correctional facility or institution;

24 D. It shall be lawful for the Legislature to authorize by law the
25 establishment and operation, under regulation and control by the
26 State, of gambling houses or casinos within the boundaries, as
27 heretofore established, of the city of Atlantic City, county of Atlantic,
28 and to license and tax such operations and equipment used in
29 connection therewith. Any law authorizing the establishment and
30 operation of such gambling establishments shall provide for the State
31 revenues derived therefrom to be applied solely for the purpose of
32 providing funding for reductions in property taxes, rental, telephone,
33 gas, electric, and municipal utilities charges of eligible senior citizens
34 and disabled residents of the State, and for additional or expanded
35 health services or benefits or transportation services or benefits to
36 eligible senior citizens and disabled residents, in accordance with
37 such formulae as the Legislature shall by law provide. The type and
38 number of such casinos or gambling houses and of the gambling
39 games which may be conducted in any such establishment shall be
40 determined by or pursuant to the terms of the law authorizing the
41 establishment and operation thereof.

42 It shall also be lawful for the Legislature to authorize by law
43 wagering at casinos or gambling houses in Atlantic City on the results
44 of any professional, college, or amateur sport or athletic event],
45 except that wagering shall not be permitted on a college sport or
46 athletic event that takes place in New Jersey or on a sport or athletic
47 event in which any New Jersey college team participates regardless
48 of where the event takes place];

1 E. It shall be lawful for the Legislature to authorize, by law, (1)
2 the simultaneous transmission by picture of running and harness
3 horse races conducted at racetracks located within or outside of this
4 State, or both, to gambling houses or casinos in the city of Atlantic
5 City and (2) the specific kind, restrictions and control of wagering at
6 those gambling establishments on the results of those races. The
7 State's share of revenues derived therefrom shall be applied for
8 services to benefit eligible senior citizens as shall be provided by law;
9 and

10 F. It shall be lawful for the Legislature to authorize, by law, the
11 specific kind, restrictions and control of wagering on the results of
12 live or simulcast running and harness horse races conducted within
13 or outside of this State. The State's share of revenues derived
14 therefrom shall be used for such purposes as shall be provided by
15 law.

16 It shall also be lawful for the Legislature to authorize by law
17 wagering at current or former running and harness horse racetracks
18 in this State on the results of any professional, college, or amateur
19 sport or athletic event~~],~~ except that wagering shall not be permitted
20 on a college sport or athletic event that takes place in New Jersey or
21 on a sport or athletic event in which any New Jersey college team
22 participates regardless of where the event takes place~~].~~

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25 2. When this proposed amendment to the Constitution is finally
26 agreed to pursuant to Article IX, paragraph 1 of the Constitution, it
27 shall be submitted to the people at the next general election occurring
28 more than three months after the final agreement and shall be
29 published at least once in at least one newspaper of each county
30 designated by the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the General
31 Assembly and the Secretary of State, not less than three months prior
32 to the general election.
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34 3. This proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be
35 submitted to the people at that election in the following manner and
36 form:

37 There shall be printed on each official ballot to be used at the
38 general election, the following:

39 a. In every municipality in which voting machines are not used,
40 a legend which shall immediately precede the question as follows:

41 If you favor the proposition printed below make a cross (X), plus
42 (+), or check (✓) in the square opposite the word "Yes." If you are
43 opposed thereto make a cross (X), plus (+) or check (✓) in the square
44 opposite the word "No."

45 b. In every municipality the following question:

	<p>NO</p>	<p>INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT</p> <p>Currently, the State Constitution prohibits wagering on college sport or athletic events taking place in New Jersey. It also prohibits wagering on an event in which a New Jersey college team participates.</p> <p>This amendment would allow the Legislature to pass laws permitting wagering on any college sport or athletic event. It would permit wagering even if a New Jersey college team participates in the competition. Such wagering would be permitted only through casinos and current or former horse racetracks.</p>

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STATEMENT

Currently, the State Constitution prohibits sports wagering on any college sport or athletic event held New Jersey or in which a New Jersey college team participates. Wagering is permitted only through casinos and current or former horse racetracks.

This amendment would permit wagering through casinos and current or former horse racetracks on all college sport or athletic events. It would permit wagering even if the event takes place in New Jersey or a New Jersey college team participates in such event.

Sports wagering in New Jersey has become widely popular since the law first permitted it. In addition, New Jersey is home to many collegiate athletic postseason and tournament events, including National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) events. Future events have already been scheduled in New Jersey, such as the East

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1 Regional of the 2025 NCAA “March Madness” Men’s College
2 Basketball Tournament. March Madness is a major sporting event
3 and extremely popular for sports bettors across the State and the
4 country. With the addition of the East Regional taking place in New
5 Jersey, the State should provide more opportunities to New Jersey
6 bettors to participate legally in such tournaments.
