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12 The amount hereinabove appropriated for the Sustain and Serve NJ Program, EDA, shall be allocated to the New Jersey Economic 13 14 Development Authority to support the Sustain and Serve NJ 15 Program. The authority may transfer the uncommitted balance 16 of any funds hereinabove appropriated for the Sustain and Serve NJ Program, EDA, for the purposes of any program established 17 pursuant to P.L.2021, c.42, P.L.2021, c.43, P.L.2021, c.45, 18 19 P.L.2020, c.46, or P.L.2021, c.47, as well as the Startup Business 20 and Nonprofit Assistance Program, established pursuant to 21 P.L. , c. The amount hereinabove appropriated for the Sustain and Serve NJ
Program, EDA, is conditioned upon the submission of a report
by the Chief Executive Officer of the New Jersey Economic
Development Authority to the Governor and the Legislature,
pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), detailing
the expenditure of program funds. At a minimum, the report

shall indicate the number of organizations that applied for
 financial assistance; the number of organizations that received
 financial assistance; the amount of financial assistance provided
 to each recipient; and a brief description of each recipient.

6 Of the amounts appropriated to the New Jersey Economic 7 Development Authority for Assistance to Food and Beverage 8 Establishments, Assistance to Businesses and Nonprofits, 9 Assistance Child Care Providers, Assistance to to 10 Microbusinesses, the Sustain and Serve NJ Program, and the 11 Startup Business and Nonprofit Assistance Program, the 12 authority may retain not more than \$1,000,000 to defray 13 administrative expenses.

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STATEMENT

This bill appropriates \$10 million from the General Fund to the
New Jersey Economic Development Authority (EDA) to support the
Sustain and Serve NJ Program.

23 In November 2020, the EDA established the Sustain and Serve 24 NJ Program. Under the program, the EDA provides grants to 25 organizations to support the bulk purchase of meals from local 26 restaurants impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Participating 27 organizations are then required to distribute the meals, free of charge, to State residents. As such, the program is designed to 28 29 support local restaurants, while also providing free meals for the 30 public.

In February 2021, the EDA announced that \$14 million in grants were expected to be awarded through the Sustain and Serve NJ Program. According to the EDA, this funding is expected to result in the purchase of approximately 1.5 million meals. By appropriating an additional \$10 million for the program, roughly one million more meals will be purchased from local restaurants and distributed to needy populations.

Additionally, the bill allows the EDA to transfer uncommitted funds to other programs administered by the authority to address the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. The bill also allows a portion of these funds to be used for administrative expenses.

As a condition of receiving State funds, the bill also requires the EDA to submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature detailing the expenditure of program funds. At a minimum, the report would be required to indicate the number of organizations that applied for financial assistance; the number of organizations that received financial assistance; the amount of financial assistance provided to each recipient; and a brief description of each recipient. 1 2
