(New section) a. There is established in the Department of 10 the Treasury a special fund to be known as the "New Jersey Pediatric Cancer Research Fund." 11 12 b. Each taxpayer shall have the opportunity to indicate on the 13 taxpayer's New Jersey gross income tax return that a portion of the 14 taxpayer's refund or an enclosed contribution shall be deposited in 15 the special fund. 16 c. Any costs incurred by the Division of Taxation for collection or administration attributable to this act may be deducted from 17 receipts collected pursuant to this act, as determined by the Director 18 19 of the Division of Budget and Accounting in the Department of the 20 Treasury. The State Treasurer shall deposit net contributions collected pursuant to this section to the "New Jersey Pediatric 21 22 Cancer Research Fund." 23 d. The Legislature shall annually appropriate all funds 24 deposited in the "New Jersey Pediatric Cancer Research Fund" 25 established pursuant to this section to the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research, established pursuant to section 4 26 of P.L.1983, c.6 (C.52:9U-4) ¹, for pediatric cancer research 27 28 projects. ¹<u>e.</u>¹ As used in this ¹[subsection] <u>section</u>,¹ "pediatric cancer 29 30 research project" means a scientific research project ¹[, which is]¹ 31 approved ¹[by the commission and] pursuant to section 2 of P.L., c. As used in this act: 39 [a.] "Approved research project" means a scientific research project, which is approved by the commission and which focuses on 40 41 the genetic, biochemical, viral, microbiological and environmental 42 causes of cancer, and may include, but is not limited to, behavioral, 43 socio-economic, demographic and psychosocial research or research 44 into methods of clinical treatment; or which focuses on pain 45 management and palliative care for persons diagnosed with cancer. 46 [b.] "Commission" means the New Jersey State Commission on 47 Cancer Research established pursuant to this act.

1 [c.] "Institutional support services" means all services, 2 facilities, equipment, personnel and expenditures associated with 3 the creation and maintenance of approved research projects.

4 [d.] <u>"Pediatric cancer research project" means a scientific</u> 5 research project approved pursuant to this act, which scientific 6 research project focuses on the causes, prevention, education, 7 screening, treatment, or cure of pediatric cancer, or the symptoms or 8 effects experienced by patients following completion of a course of 9 treatment for pediatric cancer, and may include, but shall not 10 limited to, basic, clinical, and epidemiologic research.

11 "Qualifying research institution" means the Coriell Institute for 12 Medical Research in Camden, New Jersey, Rutgers--The State 13 University, Rowan University, Princeton University and any other 14 institution approved by the commission, which is conducting an 15 approved research project. For the purposes of sections 2 through 5 16 of P.L., c. (C.), "qualifying research institution" may 17 include academic medical institutions, State or local government 18 agencies, public or private organizations within New Jersey, and 19 any other institution approved by the commission, which is 20 conducting a pediatric cancer research project.¹
