Assembly, No. 5054

1 **AN ACT** authorizing the expenditure of additional funds by the New
2 Jersey Infrastructure Bank for the purpose of making loans to
3 eligible project sponsors to finance a portion of the cost of
4 construction of environmental infrastructure projects, and
5 amending P.L.2020, c.48.

6
7 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
8 *of New Jersey:*
9

10 1. Section 1 of P.L.2020, c.48 is amended to read as follows:

11 1. a. The New Jersey Infrastructure Bank, established pursuant
12 to P.L.1985, c.334 (C.58:11B-1 et seq.) (hereinafter referred to as
13 "the trust"), is authorized to expend the aggregate sum of up to
14 **[\$1.168]** \$2.039 billion and any uncommitted balance of the
15 aggregate expenditures authorized pursuant to section 1 of
16 P.L.2000, c.93, section 1 of P.L.2001, c.224, section 1 of P.L.2002,
17 c.71, section 1 of P.L.2003, c.159, section 1 of P.L.2004, c.110,
18 section 1 of P.L.2005, c.197, section 1 of P.L.2006, c.67, section 1
19 of P.L.2007, c.140, section 1 of P.L.2008, c.67, section 1 of
20 P.L.2009, c.101, section 1 of P.L.2010, c.62, section 1 of P.L.2011,
21 c.95, section 1 of P.L.2012, c.38, section 1 of P.L.2013, c.94,
22 section 1 of P.L.2014, c.26, section 1 of P.L.2015, c.107, section 1
23 of P.L.2016, c.31 as amended by P.L.2017, c.13, section 1 of
24 P.L.2017, c.142 as amended by P.L.2017, c.327, P.L.2018, c.84 as
25 amended by P.L.2019, c.30, and section 1 of P.L.2019, c.192 as
26 amended by P.L.2019, c.515, for the purpose of making loans, to
27 the extent sufficient funds are available, to or on behalf of local
28 government units or public water utilities (hereinafter referred to as
29 "project sponsors") to finance all or a portion of the cost of
30 construction of environmental infrastructure projects listed in
31 sections 2 and 4 of **[this act]** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. ,
32 c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill) .

33 b. The trust is authorized to increase the aggregate sums specified
34 in subsection a. of this section by:

35 (1) the amounts of capitalized interest , administrative expenses
36 associated with any federal funding programs, if applicable, and the
37 bond issuance expenses as provided in subsection b. of section 7 of
38 **[this act]** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. , c. (pending
39 before the Legislature as this bill) ;

40 (2) the amounts of reserve capacity expenses and debt service
41 reserve fund requirements as provided in subsection c. of section 7 of

23 No. and Assembly Bill No. of 2020-2021 Session) .
24 c. (1) Of the sums made available to the trust from the "Water
25 Supply Trust Fund" established pursuant to subsection a. of section 15
26 of the "Water Supply Bond Act of 1981" (P.L.1981, c.261), pursuant
27 to P.L.1997, c.223, the trust is authorized to transfer such amounts to
28 the Department of Environmental Protection as needed for drinking
29 water project loans pursuant to the "Safe Drinking Water Act
30 Amendments of 1996," Pub.L.104-182, and any amendatory and
31 supplementary acts thereto (hereinafter referred to as the "Federal Safe
32 Drinking Water Act"), under terms and conditions established by the
33 Commissioner of Environmental Protection and trust, and approved by
34 the State Treasurer, which loans shall be jointly administered by the
35 trust and department.
36 (2) Of the sums appropriated to the trust from the "Wastewater
37 Treatment Trust Fund" established pursuant to section 15 of the
38 "Wastewater Treatment Bond Act of 1985," (P.L.1985, c.329),
39 pursuant to P.L.1987, c.198, the trust is authorized to transfer such
40 amounts as needed to the Clean Water State Revolving Fund
41 established pursuant to section 1 of P.L.2009, c.77 for the purposes of
42 issuing loans or providing the State match as required for the award of
43 capitalization grants made available to the State for clean water
44 projects pursuant to the "Water Quality Act of 1987" (33 U.S.C.
45 s.1251 et seq.), and any amendatory and supplementary acts thereto
46 (hereinafter referred to as the "Federal Clean Water Act").
47 (3) Of the sums appropriated to the trust from the "1992
48 Wastewater Treatment Trust Fund" established pursuant to section 27
49 of the "Green Acres, Clean Water, Farmland and Historic Preservation

1 Bond Act of 1992" (P.L.1992, c.88), pursuant to P.L.1996, c.86, the
2 trust is authorized to transfer such amounts as needed to the Clean
3 Water State Revolving Fund for the purpose of providing the State
4 match as required for the award of capitalization grants made available
5 to the State for clean water projects pursuant to the Federal Clean
6 Water Act.

7 (4) Of the sums appropriated to the trust from the "Stormwater
8 Management and Combined Sewer Overflow Abatement Fund"
9 created pursuant to section 14 of the "Stormwater Management and
10 Combined Sewer Overflow Abatement Bond Act of 1989," P.L.1989,
11 c.181, pursuant to P.L.1998, c.87, the trust is authorized to transfer
12 such amounts as needed to the Clean Water State Revolving Fund for
13 the purpose of providing the State match as required for the award of
14 capitalization grants made available to the State for clean water
15 projects pursuant to the Federal Clean Water Act.

16 (5) Of the sums appropriated to the trust from the "2003 Water
17 Resources and Wastewater Treatment Trust Fund" established
18 pursuant to subsection b. of section 19 of the "Dam, Lake, Stream,
19 Flood Control, Water Resources, and Wastewater Treatment Project
20 Bond Act of 2003" (P.L.2003, c.162), pursuant to P.L.2004, c.110, the
21 trust is authorized to transfer such amounts as needed to the Clean
22 Water State Revolving Fund for the purpose of providing the State
23 match as required for the award of capitalization grants made available
24 to the State for clean water projects pursuant to the Federal Clean
25 Water Act.

26 (6) Of the sums appropriated to the trust from repayments of loans
27 deposited in any account, including the "Clean Water State Revolving
28 Fund," "Wastewater Treatment Fund," the "1992 Wastewater
29 Treatment Fund," the "Water Supply Fund," the "Stormwater
30 Management and Combined Sewer Overflow Abatement Fund" or the
31 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund, as appropriate, pursuant to
32 sections 11 and 12 of P.L.1995, c.219, sections 11 and 12 of P.L.1996,
33 c.85, sections 11 and 12 of P.L.1997, c.221, sections 12 and 13 of
34 P.L.1998, c.84, section 11 of P.L.1999, c.174, section 11 of P.L.2000,
35 c.92, section 11 of P.L.2001, c.222, section 11 of P.L.2002, c.70,
36 section 11 of P.L.2003, c.158, section 11 of P.L.2004, c.109, section
37 11 of P.L.2005, c.196, section 11 of P.L.2006, c.68, section 10 of

1 shall transfer to the respective fund of origin the uncommitted balance
2 of all such moneys no longer utilized by the trust for such purposes.

3 d. For the purposes of **【this act】** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by
4 P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill) :

5 (1) "capitalized interest" means the amount equal to interest paid
6 on trust bonds which is funded with trust bond proceeds and the
7 earnings thereon;

8 (2) "debt service reserve fund expenses" means the debt service
9 reserve fund costs associated with reserve capacity expenses, water
10 supply projects for which the project sponsors are public water utilities
11 as provided in section 9 of P.L.1985, c.334 (C.58:11B-9), other
12 drinking water projects not eligible for, or interested in, State or
13 federal debt service reserve funds pursuant to the "Water Supply Bond
14 Act of 1981," P.L.1981, c.261 as amended and supplemented by
15 P.L.1997, c.223, and any clean water projects not eligible for, or
16 interested in, State or federal debt service reserve funds from the Clean
17 Water State Revolving Fund;

18 (3) "issuance expenses" means any costs related to the issuance of
19 trust bonds and includes, but is not limited to, the costs of financial
20 document printing, bond insurance premiums or other credit
21 enhancement, underwriters' discount, verification of financial
22 calculations, the services of bond rating agencies and trustees, the
23 employment of accountants, attorneys, financial advisors, loan
24 servicing agents, registrars, and paying agents;

25 (4) "loan origination fee" means the fee charged by the
26 Department of Environmental Protection and financed under the trust
27 loan to pay a portion of the costs incurred by the department in the
28 implementation of the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure
29 Financing Program; and

30 (5) "reserve capacity expenses" means those project costs for
31 reserve capacity not eligible for loans under rules and regulations
32 governing zero interest loans adopted by the Commissioner of
33 Environmental Protection pursuant to section 4 of P.L.1985, c.329 but
34 which are eligible for loans from the trust in accordance with the rules
35 and regulations adopted by the trust pursuant to section 27 of
36 P.L.1985, c.334 (C.58:11B-27).

37 e. The trust is authorized to increase the loan amount in the future
38 to compensate for a refunding of the issue, provided adequate savings
39 are achieved, for the loans issued pursuant to P.L.1995, c.218,
40 P.L.1996, c.87, P.L.1997, c.222, P.L.1998, c.85, P.L.1999, c.173,
41 P.L.2000, c.93, P.L.2001, c.224, P.L.2002, c.71, P.L.2003, c.159,
42 P.L.2004, c.110, P.L.2005, c.197, P.L.2006, c.67, P.L.2007, c.140,
43 P.L.2008, c.67, P.L.2009, c.101, P.L.2010, c.62, P.L.2011, c.95,
44 P.L.2012, c.38, P.L.2013, c.94, P.L.2014, c.26, P.L.2015, c.107,
45 P.L.2016, c.31 as amended by P.L.2017, c.13, P.L.2017, c.142 as
46 amended by P.L.2017, c.327, P.L.2018, c.84 as amended by P.L.2019,
47 c.30, P.L.2019, c.192 as amended by P.L.2019, c.515, and P.L.2020,
48 c.48 , as amended by P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as

11 difference between the allowable loan amount required by the
12 project based upon final building costs pursuant to subsection a. of
13 section 7 of **[this act]** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. ,
14 c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill) and the loan
15 amount certified by the vice chairperson or secretary of the trust in
16 State fiscal years 2008, 2019, and 2020 and for increased allowable
17 costs as defined and determined in accordance with the rules and
18 regulations adopted by the trust pursuant to section 27 of P.L.1985,
19 c.334 (C.58:11B-27). A loan authorized by this subsection shall be
20 made to or on behalf of the project sponsor listed, up to the

10 section 7 of 【this act】 P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. ,
11 c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill) and the loan
12 amount certified by the vice chairperson or secretary of the trust in
13 State fiscal year 2020 and for increased allowable costs as defined
14 and determined in accordance with the rules and regulations
15 adopted by the trust pursuant to section 27 of P.L.1985, c.334
16 (C.58:11B-27). A loan authorized by this subsection shall be made

13 indicated and in the priority stated, except that any such amount
14 may be reduced by the trust pursuant to subsection a. of section 7 of
15 **【this act】** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. , c. (pending
16 before the Legislature as this bill) , or if a project fails to meet the
17 requirements of section 6 of **【this act】** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended
18 by P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill) . The
19 trust is authorized to increase any such amount pursuant to
20 subsection b., c., d., e. or f. of section 7 or section 8 of **【this act】**
21 P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. , c. (pending before the
22 Legislature as this bill) .

23 c. The trust is authorized to make loans to local government
24 units for clean water projects partially funded from the "Pinelands
25 Infrastructure Trust Fund" established pursuant to section 14 of
26 P.L.1985, c.302 for the balance of allowable project costs up to the
27 individual amounts indicated, provided that any such amount may
28 be reduced by the trust pursuant to subsection a. of section 7 of
29 **【this act】** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. , c. (pending
30 before the Legislature as this bill) , or if a project fails to meet the
31 requirements of section 6 of **【this act】** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended
32 by P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill) .

(pending before the Legislature as this bill) or a financial plan of the trust for State fiscal years 2018, 2019, or 2020 developed pursuant to section 21 of P.L.1985, c.334 (C.58:11B-21) or section 25 of P.L.1997, c.224 (C.58:11B-21.1) to the contrary, a loan for an environmental infrastructure project listed in section 2 or 3 of P.L.2020, c.49, as amended by P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill), that is partially funded from the proceeds of bonds issued by the trust to the United States Environmental Protection Agency pursuant to the federal "Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act of 2014," 33 U.S.C. s.3901 et seq., shall be subject to terms and conditions regulating the blending of federal and other funds that are consistent with those provisions of Section III of the applicable financial plan of the trust for State fiscal year 2021 that reference the federal "Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act of 2014." (pending before the Legislature as this bill) by the amount of capitalized interest and issuance expenses allocable to each loan made by the trust pursuant to **【this act】** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill), provided that the increase for issuance expenses, excluding underwriters' discount, original issue discount or premiums, municipal bond insurance premiums and bond rating agency fees, and administrative expenses associated with federal funding programs, if applicable, shall not exceed 0.4 percent of the principal amount of trust bonds issued to make loans authorized by **【this act】** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

c. The trust is authorized to increase each loan amount authorized in sections 2 and 4 of **【this act】** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill) by the amount of reserve capacity expenses, and by the debt service reserve fund expenses associated with the costs identified in paragraphs (3) and (4) of subsection d. of section 1 of **【this act】** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

d. The trust is authorized to increase each loan amount authorized in sections 2 and 4 of **【this act】** P.L.2020, c.48, as amended by P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill) by the interest earned on amounts deposited for project costs pending their distribution to project sponsors.

STATEMENT

6 This bill would authorize the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank
7 (NJIB) to expend additional sums to make loans for environmental
8 infrastructure projects for Fiscal Year 2021.

9 The bill would also provide that loans for projects that utilize
10 federal funds raised pursuant to the federal "Water Infrastructure
11 Finance and Innovation Act of 2014" (WIFIA) are subject to terms
12 and conditions regulating the blending of federal and other funds
13 that are consistent with certain provisions of the FY2021 financial
14 plan of the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (NJIB), even if those
15 projects began in earlier fiscal years. In addition, the bill would
16 authorize the NJIB to expend up to \$25 million transferred to the
17 NJIB by the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) from a
18 \$60 million capital construction appropriation in the FY2021 annual
19 appropriations act, P.L.2020, c.97.

20 In July 2020, P.L.2020, c.48 was enacted into law, which
21 authorized the NJIB to expend up to \$1.168 billion, and any
22 unexpended balances from previous authorizations, to provide low-
23 interest and market-rate loans to project sponsors (primarily local
24 governments, public authorities, or public water utilities) for a
25 portion of the total costs of 178 eligible environmental
26 infrastructure projects for Fiscal Year 2021. This included 123
27 projects from the "Storm Sandy and State Fiscal Year 2020 Clean
28 Water Project Eligibility List" and 44 projects from the "Storm
29 Sandy and State Fiscal Year 2020 Drinking Water Project
30 Eligibility List." The NJIB was also authorized under P.L.2020,
31 c.48 to provide a supplemental loan to seven projects that received a
32 loan in the past and which require a supplemental loan in order to
33 meet actual costs.

34 This bill would amend the lists of environmental infrastructure
35 projects for which the NJIB is authorized to make loans pursuant to
36 P.L.2020, c.48 to include new projects and modify the trust loan
37 amounts for certain projects. This bill authorizes the NJIB to
38 expend up to \$2.039 billion, and any unexpended balances from
39 previous authorizations, to provide loans to project sponsors for a
40 total of 220 eligible environmental infrastructure projects for Fiscal
41 Year 2020. This would include 157 projects on the "Storm Sandy
42 and State Fiscal Year 2020 Clean Water Project Eligibility List" and
43 50 projects on the "Storm Sandy and State Fiscal Year 2020
44 Drinking Water Project Eligibility List." The NJIB would also be
45 authorized to make supplemental loans to nine environmental
46 infrastructure projects.
