| 23 | retired pay because a 19th Century law reduces their retirement |

1 A 19th Century law requires military retired pay to be offset, 2 dollar for dollar, by the amount of disability compensation received 3 from the VA. Military retired pay earned by service and sacrifice in defending the United States should not be reduced because a military 4 5 retiree is also eligible for veterans' disability compensation awarded for a service-connected disability. The "Retired Pay Restoration 6 7 Act" pending before Congress would permit retired members of the 8 Armed Forces who have a service-connected disability to receive 9 both military retired pay by reason of their years of military service and disability compensation from the VA. This House recognizes the 10 sacrifice of service members and their families and urges Congress 11 12 to pass the "Retired Pay Restoration Act."
