1	AN ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION urging the United States Congress to
2	pass the "K2 Veterans Care Act of 2021."
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4	WHEREAS, A presumption of service connection occurs when the
5	Department of Veterans Affairs presumes a disability is caused by
6	military service in order for a veteran to receive disability
7	compensation; and
8	WHEREAS, When a presumption of service connection has not been
9	established, a veteran seeking disability compensation must present
10	specific evidence of the current disability, the occurrence during
11	service, and a link between the claimed condition and military
12	service; and
13	WHEREAS, United States Senate Bill No. 454 and House of
14	Representatives Bill No. 1355, "The K2 Veterans Care Act of 2021,"
15	was introduced in the Senate on February 25, 2021, by Senator
16	Richard Blumenthal and the House of Representatives on February
17	25, 2021, by Representative Stephen F. Lynch in order to provide
18	healthcare and benefits to veterans who were exposed to toxic
19	substances while serving as members of the Armed Forces at Karshi-
20	Khanabad Air Base in Uzbekistan; and
21	WHEREAS, As part of the Global War on Terror, the United States
22	stationed service members at the Karshi-Khanabad, commonly
23	called K2, Air Base in Uzbekistan from October 2001 until
24	November 2005; and
25	WHEREAS, While serving at K2, service members may have been
26	exposed to jet fuel, volatile organic compounds, particulate matter
27	and dust, depleted uranium, asbestos, and lead based paint; and
28	WHEREAS, It is thought that these toxins originated from leaks in the
29	Soviet-era underground fuel-distribution system and from the Soviet
30	nuclear missiles at the base; and
31	WHEREAS, Service members at K2 were not aware of these exposures,
32	but witnessed such things as "black goo" coming out of the ground
33	and a local pond that glowed green; and
34	WHEREAS, The Department of Defense conducted a study of cancer
35	outcomes for individuals who had served at K2 that indicated service
3637	members who were stationed at K2 may have a higher risk for certain
38	cancers, and the Department of Defense and the Department of Veterans Affairs are continuing to conduct follow-up studies while
39	there remains no presumption of service connection for service

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42	WHEREAS, Currently, each claim asserted by a veteran for a disability related to service at K2 is evaluated on a case-by-case basis, this

Jersey:

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1. This House respectfully urges the United States Congress pass S.454 and H.R.1355, the "K2 Veterans Care Act of 2021."

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2. Copies of this resolution, as filed with the Secretary of State, shall be transmitted by the Clerk of the General Assembly to the Speaker and Minority Leader of the United States House of Representatives, the Majority and Minority Leaders in the United States Senate, and every member of Congress elected from this State.

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STATEMENT

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This resolution urges the United States Congress to pass the "K2 Veterans Care Act of 2021" in order to allow veterans who were exposed to toxic substances while serving at Karshi-Khanabad Air Base in Uzbekistan to receive healthcare and benefits.

The United States military stationed service members at K2 from October 2001 to November 2005. While there, service members may have been exposed to jet fuel, volatile organic compounds, particulate matter and dust, depleted uranium, asbestos, and lead based paint without their knowledge. These toxic exposures may lead to a higher risk of certain cancers. This legislation would give service members the presumption of service connection for those who served at K2 and have been diagnosed with toxic exposurerelated illnesses and diseases and access to hospital care, medical services, and nursing home care. Service members have sacrificed to serve this nation and deserve to receive healthcare and benefits for the hazards they faced during their service.
