4	WHEREAS, Elcon Recycling Services is an industrial waste treatment
5	service provider based in Israel which processes hazardous waste
6	produced by chemical, pharmaceutical, and other companies; and
7	WHEREAS, Elcon Recycling Services is applying a second time to
8	build a hazardous waste incinerator in Falls Township,
9	Pennsylvania to process hazardous industrial, medical, and other
10	waste; and
11	WHEREAS, Falls Township, Pennsylvania is located just across the
12	Delaware River from many New Jersey municipalities, including
13	our state capital of Trenton City, Hamilton Township, Bordentown
14	Township, and other nearby communities in Mercer and Burlington
15	counties; and
16	WHEREAS, Currently, Elcon Recycling Services only has facilities
17	operating in Israel where its Haifa Bay facility has recently been
18	ordered to shut down and relocate due to its history of violations of
19	air and groundwater emissions standards and its negative impact
20	and pollution to the surrounding environment in Haifa Bay; and
21	WHEREAS, Elcon Recycling Services has been denied authorization to
22	build facilities in Italy due to environmental issues created by its
23	treatment facilities; and
24	WHEREAS, In 2015, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental
25	Protection denied Elcon's request to construct a facility in the
26	Keystone Industrial Port Complex in Falls Township, Pennsylvania
27	because the business failed to demonstrate compliance with flood-
28	hazard regulations; and
29	WHEREAS, In addition, the Delaware River serves as a primary source
30	of drinking water and a popular recreational destination for millions
31	of New Jersey and Pennsylvania residents and visitors; and
32	WHEREAS, A hazardous waste treatment facility would likely degrade
33	and pollute the surrounding area and waterways which will be
34	detrimental to residents, the environment, and wildlife; and
35	WHEREAS, According to the Delaware Riverkeeper Network and
36	Pennsylvania League of Woman Voters, the facility would process
37	hazardous and medical waste including the treatment of 210,000
38	tons of raw waste per year that would include high levels of
39	mercury, cadmium, and lead; and
40	WHEREAS, According to local environmentalists, the incineration
41	treatment process would likely produce over 39 tons of air
42	emissions containing, among other pollutants, nitrous oxide,

WHEREAS, In July 2016, the Mercer County Board of Chosen
 Freeholders adopted a resolution opposing the construction of
 Elcon's proposal for a hazardous waste incinerator facility in Falls
 Township, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, Due to the high probability of pollution from both permitted and accidental discharges that would affect the air quality in the region and the water quality of the Delaware River, the Delaware Bay, the Chesapeake Bay, and other bodies of water, this House opposes the construction a toxic waste incinerator in Falls Township, Pennsylvania; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. This House opposes the construction of a toxic waste incinerator in Falls Township, Pennsylvania due to the high probability of pollution from both permitted and accidental discharges that would affect air quality in the region and the water quality of the Delaware River, the Delaware Bay, the Chesapeake Bay, and other bodies of water.

2. Copies of this resolution, as filed with the Secretary of State, shall be transmitted by the Clerk of the General Assembly to the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, the Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, each member of the Falls Township Board of Supervisors, and the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders in each county in New Jersey.

STATEMENT

This bill would oppose the construction of a hazardous waste incinerator in Falls Township, Pennsylvania by Elcon Recycling Services. Elcon Recycling Services is an industrial waste treatment service provider based in Israel which processes hazardous waste produced by chemical, pharmaceutical, and other companies. Currently, Elcon Recycling Services only has facilities operating in Israel where its Haifa Bay facility has recently been ordered to shut down and relocate due to its history of violations of air and groundwater emissions standards and its negative impact and pollution to the surrounding environment in Haifa Bay.

Elcon Recycling Services has been denied authorization to build facilities in Italy due to environmental issues created by its treatment facilities. In 2015, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection denied Elcon's request to construct a facility in the Keystone Industrial Port Complex in Falls Township,

Pennsylvania because the business failed to demonstrate compliance with flood-hazard regulations.

Elcon Recycling Services is applying a second time to build a hazardous waste incinerator in Falls Township to process hazardous industrial, medical, and other waste. In July, 2018, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection announced that Elcon has submitted all necessary application materials to the department commencing a 10-month review period for the facility. Falls Township is extremely close to the Delaware River and is a part of a densely populated residential region. In addition, the Delaware River serves as a primary source of drinking water and a popular recreational destination for millions of New Jersey and Pennsylvania residents and visitors.

A hazardous waste treatment facility would likely degrade and pollute the surrounding area and waterways which will be detrimental to residents, the environment, and wildlife. According to the Delaware Riverkeeper Network and Pennsylvania League of Woman Voters the facility would process hazardous and medical waste including the treatment of 210,000 tons of raw waste per year that would include high levels of mercury, cadmium, and lead. According to local environmentalists, the incineration treatment process would likely produce over 39 tons of air emissions containing, among other pollutants, nitrous oxide, ammonia, hydrochloric acid, volatile organic compounds, sulfur oxide, and total particulate matter.

Due to the high probability of pollution from both permitted and accidental discharges that would affect the air quality in the region and the water quality of the Delaware River, the Chesapeake Bay, and other bodies of water, this House opposes the construction a toxic waste incinerator in Falls Township, Pennsylvania.
