P.L. 2020, Joint Resolution No. 2, *approved August 31*, 2020 Senate Joint Resolution No. 85 (Second Reprint)

A JOINT RESOLUTION designating August 31 of each year as 1 2 "Overdose Awareness Day" in New Jersey. 3 WHEREAS, ¹[Drug addiction] Substance use disorder ¹ is a chronic 4 disease ¹[,] ¹ characterized by ¹the problematic, ¹ compulsive ¹, ¹ 5 or ¹[difficult to control drug] <u>difficult-to-control</u> ¹ use ¹<u>of drugs</u> 6 and other substances, 1 despite harmful consequences; and 7 WHEREAS, ¹[Drug addiction] <u>Substance use disorder</u>, particularly 8 when it involves opioid drugs, 1 is seen by both the 1 federal 1 9 Centers for Disease Control ¹ and Prevention ¹ and the World 10 11 Health Organization as a fast-growing epidemic that can all too 12 easily lead to overdose and death; and 13 WHEREAS, In 2018, 67,367 individuals died from drug overdoses in 14 the United States; and WHEREAS, In New Jersey alone, 2,900 people died from drug 15 16 overdoses in 2018; and 17 WHEREAS, Furthermore, for every drug overdose that results in 18 death, there are many more nonfatal overdoses, each taking an 19 emotional and economic toll on ¹[the individual] individuals ¹, their ¹ [family] families ¹, and the community at large; and 20 WHEREAS, ¹[Drug addiction] A substance use disorder ¹ can fuel 21 22 feelings of shame, guilt, embarrassment, depression, and 23 hopelessness, causing individuals to resist seeking treatment and 24 support; and WHEREAS, Overdose Awareness Day is a global event held on 25 August 31 of each year that aims to raise awareness of drug 26 27 overdoses, reduce the stigma of a drug-related death, and ¹[to]¹ acknowledge the grief felt by families and friends remembering 28 those who ¹ [have died or had a permanent injury] <u>died or were</u> 29 permanently injured 1 as a result of a drug overdose; and 30 ²[WHEREAS, To further the goals of Overdose Awareness Day, all 31 flags throughout the State should be flown at half-staff for the 32 day's duration; and **]**² 33 34 WHEREAS, Recognizing Overdose Awareness Day in New Jersey sends a strong message to former ¹[or] and ¹ current substance 35 users, namely, that they are valued, and that overdose death is 36
