## **SYNOPSIS**

Requires new voting machines purchased or leased for use in elections in this State to produce paper record of each vote cast.

## S102 GILL, STACK

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AN ACT concerning the requirement for voting machines to produce 1 2 a paper record of each vote cast and amending R.S.19:48-1 and 3 P.L.1973, c.82. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. R.S.19:48-1 is amended to read as follows: 9 19:48-1. a. Any thoroughly tested and reliable voting machines 10 may be adopted, rented, purchased or used, which shall be so constructed as to fulfill the following requirements: 11 12 (a) It shall secure to the voter secrecy in the act of voting; 13 (b) It shall provide facilities for such number of office columns, not less than 40 and not exceeding 60, as the purchasing authorities 14 15 may specify and of as many political parties or organizations, not 16 exceeding nine, as may make nominations, and for or against as 17 many questions, not exceeding 30, as submitted; 18 (c) It shall, except at primary elections, permit the voter to vote 19 for all the candidates of one party or in part for the candidates of 20 one party or one or more parties; 21 (d) It shall permit the voter to vote for as many persons for an 22 office as he is lawfully entitled to vote for, but no more; 23 (e) It shall prevent the voter from voting for the same person 24 more than once for the same office; 25 (f) It shall permit the voter to vote for or against any question 26 he may have the right to vote on, but no other; 27 (g) It shall for use in primary elections be so equipped that the 28 election officials can stop a voter from voting for all candidates 29 except those of the voter's party; (h) It shall correctly register or record and accurately count all 30 31 votes cast for any and all persons, and for or against any and all 32 questions; 33 (i) It shall be provided with a "protective counter" or 34 "protective device" whereby any operation of the machine before or 35 after the election will be detected; 36 (j) It shall be so equipped with such protective devices as shall 37 prevent the operation of the machine after the polls are closed; 38 (k) It shall be provided with a counter which shall show at all 39 times during an election how many persons have voted; (1) It shall be provided with a model, illustrating the manner of 40 voting on the machine, suitable for the instruction of voters; 41 42 (m) It must permit a voter to vote for any person for any office, 43 except delegates and alternates to national party conventions, 44 whether or not nominated as a candidate by any party or

organization by providing an opportunity to indicate such names or
 name;

(n) It shall be equipped with a permanently affixed box or
container of sufficient strength, size and security to hold all
emergency ballots and pre-punched single-hole envelopes and with
a clipboard and a table-top privacy screen;

7 (o) It shall not use mechanical lever machines or punch cards to8 record votes.

All voting machines used in any election shall be provided with a
screen, hood or curtain, which shall be so made and adjusted as to
conceal the voter and his action while voting.

12 It shall also be provided with one device for each party for 13 voting for all the presidential electors of that party by one 14 operation, and a ballot therefor containing only the words 15 "presidential electors for," preceded by the name of that party and followed by the names of the candidates thereof for the offices of 16 17 President and Vice-President and a registering device therefor 18 which shall register the vote cast for such electors when thus voted 19 collectively.

b. (1) By January 1, 2009, each voting machine shall produce 20 21 an individual permanent paper record for each vote cast, which shall 22 be made available for inspection and verification by the voter at the 23 time the vote is cast, and preserved for later use in any manual 24 audit. In the event of a recount of the results of an election, the 25 voter-verified paper record shall be the official tally in that election. A waiver of the provisions of this paragraph shall be granted by 26 27 the Secretary of State if the technology to produce a permanent voter-verified paper record for each vote cast is not commercially 28 29 available.

30 (2) The provisions of paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be 31 suspended until: (i) the Secretary of State and the State Treasurer 32 certify in writing that sufficient funds have been provided by the 33 federal government and received by the State to offset the entire 34 cost of ensuring that each voting machine used in this State produces an individual permanent paper record for each vote cast; 35 36 or (ii) the annual appropriation act contains an appropriation of 37 sufficient funds to ensure that each voting machine used in this 38 State produces an individual permanent paper record for each vote 39 cast and such appropriated funds have not been reserved by the 40 Governor under a spending reduction plan; or (iii) the Secretary of 41 State and the State Treasurer certify in writing that sufficient funds 42 have been provided by the federal government and received by the 43 State, and the annual appropriation act contains an appropriation of 44 sufficient unreserved funds, to ensure, when such funds are 45 combined, that each voting machine used in this State produces an 46 individual paper record for each vote cast.

47 <u>c. Each voting machine newly-purchased or leased following</u>
48 <u>the effective date of P.L.</u>, <u>c. (pending before the Legislature as</u>

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this bill) shall produce an individual permanent paper record for 1 2 each vote cast, which shall be made available for inspection and 3 verification by the voter at the time the vote is cast, and preserved 4 for later use in any manual audit. In the event of a recount of the 5 results of an election, the voter-verified paper record of each machine required under this subsection shall be used in the 6 7 calculation of the official tally in that election. 8 (cf: P.L.2009, c.17, s.1) 9 10 2. Section 3 of P.L.1973, c.82 (C.19:53A-3) is amended to read 11 as follows: 12 3. Every electronic voting system, consisting of a voting device 13 in combination with automatic tabulating equipment, acquired or 14 used in accordance with this act, shall: 15 a. Provide for voting in secrecy, except in the case of voters who have received assistance as provided by law; 16 17 b. Permit each voter to vote at any election for all persons and 18 offices for whom and for which he is lawfully entitled to vote; to 19 vote for or against any question upon which he is entitled to vote; and the automatic tabulating equipment shall reject choices 20 21 recorded on his ballot if the number of choices exceeds the number 22 which he is entitled to vote for the office or on the measure; 23 c. Permit each voter, at presidential elections, by one mark to vote for the candidates of that party for president, vice president, 24 25 and their presidential electors; 26 d. Permit each voter, at other than primary elections, to vote for 27 the nominees of one or more parties and for independent candidates; 28 and personal choice or write-in candidates; 29 Permit each voter in primary elections to vote for candidates e. in the party primary in which he is qualified to vote, and the 30 automatic tabulating equipment shall reject any votes cast for 31 32 candidates of another party; Prevent the voter from voting for the same person more than 33 f. 34 once for the same office; 35 Be suitably designed for the purpose used, of durable g. 36 construction, and may be used safely, efficiently, and accurately in 37 the conduct of elections and counting ballots; 38 h. When properly operated, record correctly and count 39 accurately every vote cast, including all overvotes or undervotes 40 and all affirmative votes or negative votes on all public questions or 41 referenda; 42 i. (1) By January 1, 2009, each voting machine shall produce an individual permanent paper record for each vote cast, which shall 43 44 be made available for inspection and verification by the voter at the 45 time the vote is cast, and preserved for later use in any manual 46 audit. In the event of a recount of the results of an election, the 47 voter-verified paper record shall be the official tally in that election. A waiver of the provisions of this subsection shall be granted by 48

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the Secretary of State if the technology to produce a permanent
voter-verified paper record for each vote cast is not commercially
available.]

4 (2) The provisions of paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be 5 suspended until: (i) the Secretary of State and the State Treasurer 6 certify in writing that sufficient funds have been provided by the 7 federal government and received by the State to offset the entire 8 cost of ensuring that each voting machine used in this State 9 produces an individual permanent paper record for each vote cast; 10 or (ii) the annual appropriation act contains an appropriation of 11 sufficient funds to ensure that each voting machine used in this 12 State produces an individual permanent paper record for each vote 13 cast and such appropriated funds have not been reserved by the 14 Governor under a spending reduction plan; or (iii) the Secretary of State and the State Treasurer certify in writing that sufficient funds 15 16 have been provided by the federal government and received by the 17 State, and the annual appropriation act contains an appropriation of 18 sufficient unreserved funds, to ensure, when such funds are 19 combined, that each voting machine used in this State produces an 20 individual paper record for each vote cast.

21 j. Each voting machine newly-purchased or leased following 22 the effective date of P.L., c. (pending before the Legislature as 23 this bill) shall produce an individual permanent paper record for 24 each vote cast, which shall be made available for inspection and 25 verification by the voter at the time the vote is cast, and preserved 26 for later use in any manual audit. In the event of a recount of the 27 results of an election, the voter-verified paper record of each 28 machine required under this subsection shall be used in the 29 calculation of the official tally in that election.

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3. This act shall take effect on January 1 next following enactment.

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STATEMENT

38 Under current law, the requirement for the purchase of new 39 voting machines or retrofitting of existing voting machines to 40 produce a paper record of the votes cast has been suspended until 41 funding is made available from State or federal sources. This bill 42 would require that new voting machines purchased or leased 43 following the bill's effective date must produce a paper record of 44 each vote cast.

45 Specifically, the bill provides that each voting machine that is 46 purchased or leased following the bill's effective date would be 47 required to produce an individual permanent paper record for each 48 vote cast, which must be made available for inspection and

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verification by the voter at the time the vote is cast, and preserved 1 2 for later use in any manual audit. In the event of a recount of the 3 results of an election, the voter-verified paper record of each 4 machine so purchased or leased would be used in the calculation of the official tally in that election. 5 6 The bill also deletes a provision in current law that allows the 7 Secretary of State to grant a waiver from the requirement to 8 purchase new voting machines or retrofit all existing voting 9 machines if the technology to produce a permanent voter-verified

paper record for each vote cast is not commercially available. This
change is intended to reflect that the technology is now
commercially available.

This bill is prospective in application, and would apply to voting
machines purchased or leased following its effective date. The bill

15 would take effect on January 1 next following enactment.
