AN ACT establishing a commission to study the effects of P.L.2017,
 c.239 (C.30:4D-7n through 7o) on nursing homes in the State.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 7 1. a. There is established a study commission to be known as 8 the "Impact of Medicaid Personal Care Services Reimbursement 9 Change on Nursing Homes Study Commission." The purpose of the study commission shall be to analyze the effects of the 10 adjustment to the Medicaid hourly reimbursement rate for personal 11 12 care services within the Medicaid program resulting from the enactment of P.L.2017, c.239 (C.30:4D-7n and 30:4D-7o)¹, as 13 amended by P.L.2019, c.275,¹ 14 and any corresponding 15 appropriations, on nursing homes in the State. Specifically, the commission shall analyze the effects of the increase in the hourly 16 17 reimbursement rate on the operations, ability to comply with any 18 minimum staffing requirements, employee retention, financial 19 health, resident costs, and related issues on nursing homes in the 20 State, including whether any nursing homes closed following the effective date of P.L.2017, c.239 ¹or the enactment of P.L.2019, 21 c.275¹ and the reasons therefor. The commission shall also review 22 the source of State funds used to support the rate increase, and 23 determine, where possible, any reduction in funding of other State 24 25 budget items that may have resulted from the necessity of funding the rate increase. To this end, the commission shall solicit data or 26 information from nursing homes in the State¹[,]¹ or other entities, 27 as necessary to carry out its duties hereunder. 28
- b. The Impact of Medicaid Personal Care Services
 Reimbursement Change on Nursing Homes Study Commission shall
 consist of nine members as follows:
- ¹(1)¹ the ¹[Commissioner] <u>Commissioners</u>¹ of Human
 Services¹[, or the commissioner's designee; the Commissioner of]
 and¹ Health, or ¹[the commissioner's designee] <u>their designees</u>¹;
- $1(2)^{1}$ five members of the public with significant operational, financial, or managerial expertise in the nursing home industry, three of whom shall be representatives of entities currently operating one or more nursing homes in the State, to be appointed as follows:
- 40 ¹(a)¹ two members ¹[to] <u>shall</u>¹ be appointed by the Speaker of 41 the General Assembly;
- 42 ¹(b)¹ two members ¹[to] <u>shall</u>¹ be appointed by the Minority
 43 Leader of the Senate; and

and budgetary matters, ¹[to] <u>who shall</u>¹ be appointed by the
President of the Senate.

8 c. The study commission shall organize as soon as practicable 9 after the appointment of its members. Upon its organization, the study commission shall select a chairperson from among its 10 11 members. ¹<u>The chairperson shall appoint a secretary who need not</u> <u>be a member of the commission.</u>¹ The study commission may meet 12 and¹[holding] <u>hold¹</u> meetings at the times and places ¹[it may 13 designate] as shall be designated by the chair¹. A majority of the 14 15 authorized members shall constitute a quorum $\frac{1}{\text{for the purpose of}}$ conducting official commission business¹. Vacancies shall be filled 16 17 in the same manner as the original appointments were made. The members shall serve without ¹[remuneration] <u>compensation</u>¹, but 18 shall be eligible for reimbursement for necessary and reasonable 19 20 expenses incurred in the performance of their duties on the 21 commission, within the limits of funds appropriated or otherwise 22 made available to the study commission for its purposes.

d. The study commission is entitled to receive assistance and
services from any State, county, or municipal department, board,
commission, or agency, as may be available to it for its purposes.
¹<u>The Department of Human Services shall provide staff and</u>
administrative support to the commission.¹

e. Not later than 12 months after the initial meeting of the 28 29 study commission, it shall prepare and submit a written report to the 30 Governor, and to the Legislature pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, 31 c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), presenting its analysis of the effect of the enactment of P.L.2017, c.239 (C.30:4D-7n through 30:4D-7o)¹, as 32 amended by P.L.2019, c.275,¹ on nursing homes in the State, as 33 well as any recommendations ¹for legislation or other action as the 34 <u>commission deems appropriate</u>¹. The study commission shall 35 36 expire on the first day of the third month next following submission 37 of its written report to the Governor and the Legislature, as required 38 by this subsection.

2. This act shall take effect immediately upon enactment ¹and
shall expire on the first day of the third month next following
<u>submission of the study commission's report</u>¹.
