#### **SYNOPSIS**

Requires certain health care professionals to undergo explicit and implicit bias training.

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As reported by the Assembly Appropriations Committee on February 24, 2021, with amendments.

1	AN ACT concerning <sup>3</sup> [implicit] <sup>3</sup> bias training and supplementing
2	Title 26 <sup>3</sup> and Title 45 <sup>3</sup> of the Revised Statutes.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. Every hospital that provides inpatient maternity services and every birthing center licensed in the State pursuant to P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.) shall implement an evidence-based <sup>3</sup>explicit and <sup>3</sup> implicit bias training program for <sup>1</sup>:
- (1)<sup>1</sup> all health professionals who provide perinatal treatment and care to pregnant <sup>2</sup>[women] persons<sup>2</sup> at the hospital or birthing center <sup>2</sup>regardless of the compensation agreement, contractual status, or privilege status that may exist between the health professional and the hospital or birthing center<sup>2</sup>; and
- (2) all <sup>3</sup>[administrative and clerical] supportive services <sup>3</sup> staff members <sup>2</sup>, as defined by the Department of Health, <sup>2</sup> who interact with pregnant <sup>2</sup>[women] persons <sup>2</sup> at the hospital or birthing center

A hospital or birthing center that implements an explicit and implicit bias training program pursuant to this section shall ensure that the program is structured in a manner that permits health care professionals to be eligible to receive continuing education credits for participation in the program.

- b. The training program shall include, but not be limited to:
- (1) identifying previous and current unconscious biases and misinformation when providing perinatal treatment and care to <sup>1</sup>, or interacting with, <sup>1</sup> pregnant <sup>2</sup>[women] persons<sup>2</sup>;
- (2) identifying <sup>3</sup>environmental, <sup>3</sup> personal, interpersonal, institutional, and cultural barriers to inclusion;
- (3) information on the effects of historical and contemporary exclusion and oppression of minority communities;
- (4) information about cultural identity across racial <sup>3</sup>[and], <sup>3</sup> ethnic <sup>3</sup>, and other marginalized <sup>3</sup> groups;
- (5) information about communicating more effectively across racial, ethnic, religious, and gender identities;
  - (6) information about reproductive justice;
  - (7) a discussion on power dynamics and organizational decision-making and their effects on <sup>3</sup>explicit and <sup>3</sup> implicit bias;
- 39 (8) a discussion on <sup>3</sup>[health]<sup>3</sup> inequities and racial <sup>3</sup>[and],<sup>3</sup>
  40 ethnic <sup>3</sup>and other<sup>3</sup> disparities within the field of perinatal care, and
  41 how <sup>3</sup>explicit and<sup>3</sup> implicit bias may contribute to pregnancy42 related deaths and maternal and infant health outcomes; <sup>2</sup>[and]<sup>2</sup>

- 1 (9) corrective measures to decrease <sup>3</sup>explicit and <sup>3</sup> implicit bias 2 at the interpersonal and institutional levels <sup>2</sup>; and
- 3 (10) review of the annual report of the New Jersey Maternal
  4 Mortality Review Committee.<sup>2</sup>
- <sup>2</sup>The Department of Health shall identify an <sup>3</sup>explicit and <sup>3</sup> implicit bias training tool to be utilized by the <sup>3</sup>explicit and <sup>3</sup> implicit bias training program implemented by a hospital or birthing center pursuant to this section. The use of the department's training tool by a hospital or birthing center shall not preclude the hospital or birthing center from utilizing additional or customized training tools in addition to the department's training tool<sup>2</sup>.
- c. A health care professional who provides perinatal treatment and care to pregnant <sup>2</sup>[women] persons<sup>2</sup> at a hospital that provides inpatient maternity services or a birthing center licensed in the State pursuant to P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.) <sup>1</sup>and all <sup>3</sup>[administrative and clerical] supportive<sup>3</sup> staff members who interact with pregnant <sup>2</sup>[women] persons<sup>2</sup> at the hospital or birthing center<sup>1</sup> shall:
  - (1) complete the training program on <sup>3</sup>explicit and <sup>3</sup> implicit bias at such times and intervals as the hospital or birthing center shall require;

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- (2) complete a refresher course under the training program, designed to provide the health care professional <sup>1</sup>or <sup>3</sup>[administrative or clerical] supportive <sup>3</sup> staff member <sup>1</sup> with updated information about racial, ethnic, and cultural identity, and best practices in decreasing interpersonal and institutional implicit bias, every two years or on a more frequent basis, if deemed necessary by the hospital or birthing center; and
- 29 (3) receive a certification <sup>2</sup>of completion<sup>2</sup> from the hospital or 30 birthing center upon successful completion of the training program.
- d. <sup>1</sup>A health care professional who completes a continuing 31 education course on <sup>3</sup>explicit and <sup>3</sup> implicit bias pursuant to section 32  $(2, 3, {}^{2}[or]^{2} + {}^{3}[^{2}, or 5^{2}], 5, or 7^{3} of P.L., c. (C., C.)$ 33 or C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) shall be 34 deemed to have satisfied the <sup>3</sup>explicit and <sup>3</sup> implicit bias training 35 requirement set forth in subsection c. of this section for the 36 37 licensure or certification period in which the continuing education course was completed. 38
- e. In the event that a hospital or birthing center fails to implement an explicit and implement an explicit and implicit bias training program pursuant to this section, the Department of Health shall invoke penalties or take administrative action against the hospital or birthing center.

  Any penalties imposed or administrative actions taken by the department pursuant to this subsection may be imposed in a summary proceeding.

f.<sup>2</sup> As used in this section:

2 "Explicit bias" means attitudes and beliefs about a person or group on a conscious level.<sup>3</sup>

<sup>2</sup>"Health care professional" means a person licensed or certified to practice a health care profession pursuant to Title 45 of the Revised Statutes.<sup>2</sup>

"Implicit bias" means a bias in judgment or behavior that results from subtle cognitive processes, including implicit prejudice and implicit stereotypes, that often operate at a level below conscious awareness and without intentional control.

"Implicit stereotypes" means the unconscious attributions of particular qualities to a member of a certain social group, influenced by experience, and based on learned associations between various qualities and social categories, including race and gender.

<sup>2</sup>"Perinatal care" means the provision of care during pregnancy, labor, delivery, postpartum and neonatal periods.<sup>2</sup>

12. The State Board of Medical Examiners shall require that the number of credits of continuing medical education required of each person licensed as a physician who provides perinatal treatment and care to pregnant [women] persons, as a condition of biennial registration pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1971, c.236 (C.45:9-6.1), include one credit of educational programs or topics concerning explicit and implicit bias, which educational programs and topics shall meet the requirements for a training program set forth in subsection b. of section 1 of P.L., c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). The continuing medical education requirement in this subsection shall be subject to the provisions of section 10 of P.L.2001, c.307 (C.45:9-7.1) [nicluding, but not limited to, the authority of the board to waive the provisions of this section for a specific individual if the board deems it is appropriate to do so ]2.1

13. The State Board of Medical Examiners shall require that the number of credits of continuing medical education required of each person licensed as a physician assistant who provides

2 [prenatal or ]² perinatal treatment and care to pregnant 2 [women] persons², as a condition of biennial renewal pursuant to section 4 of P.L.1991, c.378 (C.45:9-27.13), include one credit of educational programs or topics concerning 3 explicit and 3 implicit bias, which educational programs and topics shall meet the requirements for a training program set forth in subsection b. of section 1 of P.L., c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). The continuing medical education requirement in this subsection shall be subject to the provisions of section 16 of P.L.1991, c.378
