SYNOPSIS

Permits person diagnosed with autism or communication disability to voluntarily make notation on driver's license, identification card, and in MVC registry; establishes program to train law enforcement officers in interactions with persons with autism or communication disabilities.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

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AN ACT concerning persons with autism or communication
 disabilities and supplementing Title 39 and Title 53 of the
 Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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8 1. a. The Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall permit a basic driver's license or non-9 driver identification card holder to voluntarily indicate on the 10 holder's basic driver's license or non-driver identification card that 11 12 the person has been diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder or a communication disability by a physician, psychologist, or any 13 14 other health care professional licensed pursuant to Title 45 of the 15 **Revised Statutes.**

16 The designation shall be used by a law enforcement officer or an 17 emergency medical professional to identify and effectively 18 communicate with a person who has been diagnosed with an autism 19 spectrum disorder or communication disability and shall not be used 20 for any other purpose by any other person.

b. The designation indicating that a person has been diagnosed
with an autism spectrum disorder or a communication disability
pursuant to subsection a. of this section shall be given a restriction
code that shall be displayed on the person's driver's license or nondriver identification in accordance with procedures prescribed by
the chief administrator.

A holder of a basic driver's license or non-driver identification
card who makes a voluntary designation pursuant to this section
shall have the opportunity to remove the designation at any time.

c. As used in this section, "communication disability" means a
condition involving an impairment in the person's ability to receive,
send, process, or comprehend concepts or verbal, nonverbal, or
graphic symbol systems, that may result in a primary disability or
may be secondary to other disabilities.

b. The Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle
Commission shall establish and maintain an automated Statewide
registry accessible by law enforcement officers for the purposes of
identifying and effectively communicating with a person who has

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been diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder or communication
 disability by a physician, psychologist, or any other health care

3 professional licensed pursuant to Title 45 of the Revised Statutes.

4 The chief administrator shall permit a person diagnosed with an 5 autism spectrum disorder or communication disability to voluntarily 6 report the diagnosis to the commission for inclusion in the registry. 7 The registry shall be capable of storing information, which shall 8 include, but not limited to: the license plate and registration 9 information of any motor vehicle that the person intends to 10 regularly operate; the emergency contact information of a person 11 who can communicate on behalf of the person who has been 12 diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder or communication disability; and any other information that may assist a law 13 14 enforcement officer when communicating with the person.

c. The holder of a New Jersey ¹[State]¹ basic driver's license
or non-driver identification card may voluntarily submit
information to the registry established pursuant to subsection a.,
through the commission's website, by mail, or when completing an
application for a driver's license, motor vehicle registration, or nondriver identification card issued by the commission.

A holder of a New Jersey ¹[State]¹ basic driver's license or nondriver identification card who submits information to the registry established pursuant to this section shall have the opportunity to revise ¹the information¹, update the information, or be removed from the registry at any time.

26 d. Information submitted pursuant to this section shall only be 27 available to: (1) employees of the commission who are designated 28 by the chief administrator to collect and maintain the information; 29 and (2) law enforcement officers when accessing the person's motor 30 vehicle records. The information shall be exclusively used during a 31 motor vehicle stop or other law enforcement action to assist law 32 enforcement officers in identifying and effectively communicating 33 with a person who has been diagnosed with an autism spectrum 34 disorder or communication disability.

Any information submitted to the commission pursuant to this section shall not be considered a government record pursuant to P.L.1963, c.73 (C.47:1A-1 et seq.), P.L.2001, c.404 (C.47:1A-5 et al.), or the common law concerning access to public records and shall not be discoverable as a government record by any person, entity, or governmental agency, except upon a subpoena issued by a grand jury or a court order in a criminal matter.

The chief administrator and employees of the commission 42 e. 43 who are designated by the chief administrator, for the purposes of 44 discharging their duties pursuant to P.L. , c. (C.) (pending 45 before the Legislature as this bill), shall not be liable to any person 46 for civil damages, or subject to criminal prosecution resulting from 47 or caused by: (1) any disruption or failure in Internet service caused 48 by any accident, malfunction, act of sabotage or God, or any other

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condition or circumstance that the commission has not, directly or 1 2 indirectly, caused, and which prevents the holder of a New Jersey 3 ¹[State]¹basic driver's license or non-driver identification card from accessing, or inputting information into, the registry 4 5 established pursuant to this section or which results in, or prevents, 6 the chief administrator and designated commission employees and 7 law enforcement officers from accessing, establishing, or 8 maintaining the database; (2) any misuse of, or the failure or 9 omission to input accurate information, or the inputting of 10 inaccurate or outdated information into the registry by any holder of a New Jersey ¹[State]¹ basic driver's license or non-driver 11 identification card; or (3) the inability of any law enforcement 12 officer to make contact, in good faith, with any designated 13 14 emergency contact person. This limitation of liability is 15 inapplicable if such failure resulted from a malicious purpose or a wanton and willful disregard for the safety of persons or property. 16 17 f. The chief administrator may adopt, pursuant to the

"Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), any rules or regulations necessary for the implementation of P.L. c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

3. a. As used in this section, "communication disability"

27 The ¹[Superintendent of the Division of State Police within b. 28 the Department of Law and Public Safety, in consultation with the 29 Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission 30 and the Commissioner of Human Services, New Jersey Office of the Attorney General¹ shall develop a program to assist and train 31 32 law enforcement officers to identify and effectively communicate 33 with a person who has been diagnosed with an autism spectrum 34 disorder or a communication disability by a physician, psychologist, 35 or any other health care professional licensed pursuant to Title 45 of 36 the Revised Statutes.

37 The program shall also include training in de-escalation methods 38 when interacting with a person who has been diagnosed with an 39 autism spectrum disorder or a communication disability, proper 40 utilization of the registry established pursuant section 2 of 41 P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), and any 42 other information, as recommended by the Commissioner of Human Services, that may be useful to law enforcement officers when 43 44 interacting with a person who has been diagnosed with an autism 45 spectrum disorder or a communication disability.

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c. The program established pursuant to subsection b. of this
 section shall be available annually to every county and municipal
 law enforcement agency in this State.

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4. a. Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall take effect on the first
day of the seventh month ¹[after] <u>following</u>¹ enactment, but the
Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission
may take any administrative action in advance ¹<u>of that date</u>¹ as shall
be necessary for the timely implementation of this act.

b. Section 3 of this act shall take effect on the first day of the 10 ¹[by] but¹ the thirteenth month enactment, 11 following Superintendent of the Division of State Police may take any 12 administrative action in advance $\frac{1}{\text{of that date}}$ as shall be necessary 13 for the timely implementation of this act. 14
