Establishes NJ Fuel Cell Task Force to increase use of fuel cells in State.

#### S762 [1R] GOPAL, LAGANA

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AN ACT establishing the New Jersey Fuel Cell Task Force, and 1 supplementing Title <sup>1</sup>[26] 48<sup>1</sup> of the Revised Statutes. 2 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 1. a. There is established in the <sup>1</sup> [Department of Environmental 7 Protection] Board of Public Utilities<sup>1</sup> the New Jersey Fuel Cell Task 8 9 Force. The purpose of the task force shall be to develop a plan to increase the use of fuel cells in the State and to provide information, 10 11 education, and resources for that purpose. The task force shall: 12 (1) serve as a resource to State departments and local governments 13 on fuel cell issues; 14 (2) assist in the growth of fuel cell businesses in the State; 15 (3) increase the use of fuel cells throughout State government departments and agencies; 16 17 (4) develop a strategy for the development of infrastructure to 18 support the use of fuel cells; and 19 (5) provide information and educational materials to the public, 20 government, and industry about the use and benefits of fuel cells. In conducting its duties, the task force shall consult with the United 21 22 States Department of Energy and any fuel cell organizations that may 23 exist in other states. b. The task force shall consist of <sup>1</sup>[13] 15<sup>1</sup> members as follows: 24 (1) The Commissioner of Environmental Protection, the President 25 of the Board of Public Utilities, the Commissioner of Transportation, 26 27 the Commissioner of Community Affairs, the Chief Executive Officer 28 of the New Jersey Economic Development Authority, who shall serve 29 ex officio, or their respective designees; and 30 (2) the following public members, appointed by the Governor: 31 (a) one member representing a fuel cell advocacy group in the 32 State; 33 (b) one member representing fuel cell manufacturers; 34 (c) one member representing suppliers of hydrogen for fuel cells; (d) one member representing fuel cell vehicle manufacturers; 35 (e) two members of the academic community with expertise in 36 37 fuel cells; 38 (f) one member representing a manufacturer of stationary fuel 39 cells; <sup>1</sup>[and]<sup>1</sup> 40 (g) one member with expertise in fuel cell powered material 41 handling equipment <sup>1</sup>; 42 (h) one member representing local government with expertise in 43 municipal land use matters; and (i) one member with expertise in retail fuel sales and distribution<sup>1</sup>. 44 EXPLANATION - Matter enclosed in **bold-faced** brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter underlined thus is new matter.

Matter enclosed in superscript numerals has been adopted as follows: <sup>1</sup>Senate SEN committee amendments adopted June 4, 2020.

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c. All appointments to the task force shall be made no later than 1 90 days after the effective date of this act. Each <sup>1</sup>public<sup>1</sup> member shall 2 serve for four years or until a successor is appointed, and vacancies 3 4 shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. The 5 members of the task force shall serve without compensation, but shall 6 be eligible for reimbursement for necessary and reasonable expenses 7 incurred in the performance of their official duties within the limits of 8 funds appropriated or otherwise made available to the task force for its 9 purposes.

10 d. The task force shall organize as soon as practicable following 11 the appointment of  ${}^{1}all^{1}$  its public members and shall select a 12 chairperson and a vice-chairperson from among its members, as well 13 as a secretary who need not be a member of the task force. A majority 14 of the  ${}^{1}full^{1}$  membership of the task force shall constitute a quorum for 15 the transaction of task force business. The task force may meet and 16 hold hearings at the place or places the task force designates.

17 The <sup>1</sup>[Department of Environmental Protection] <u>Board of Public</u> 18 <u>Utilities</u><sup>1</sup> shall provide staff support to the task force. The task force 19 shall be entitled to call to its assistance and avail itself of the services 20 of the employees of any State, county, or municipal department, board, 21 bureau, commission, or agency as the task force may require and as 22 may be available to the task force for its purposes.

e. No later than one year after its organization, and annually thereafter, the task force shall prepare and submit to the Governor and, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), <sup>1</sup>to<sup>1</sup> the Legislature, a report detailing the task force's plan to increase the use of fuel cells in the State, including any recommendations for legislative or regulatory action that are necessary to effectuate the plan.

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31 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
