SYNOPSIS

Allocates Amistad Commission in but not of DOE; requires commission to elect chairperson and appoint executive director; requires public schools to include instruction on accomplishments and contributions of African Americans to American society.

AN ACT concerning the Amistad Commission, amending 1 2 P.L.2002, c.75, and supplementing chapter 35 of Title 18A of the 3 New Jersey Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. Section 2 of P.L.2002, c.75 (C.52:16A-87) is amended to 9 read as follows: 10 2. a. The Amistad Commission, so named in honor of the 11 group of enslaved Africans led by Joseph Cinque who, while being 12 transported in 1839 on a vessel named the Amistad, gained their 13 freedom after overthrowing the crew and eventually having their case successfully argued before the United States Supreme Court, is 14 15 created and established in the Executive Branch of the State 16 Government. For the purposes of complying with the provisions of 17 Article V, Section IV, paragraph 1 of the New Jersey Constitution, the commission is allocated [within the Department of State] in but 18 19 not of the Department of Education, but notwithstanding this 20 allocation, the commission shall be independent of any supervision 21 or control by the department or any board or officer thereof. 22 ¹The executive director of the Amistad Commission shall submit 23 requests for the budget of the Amistad Commission directly to the 24 Governor who shall review the requests and forward them to the 25 Division of Budget and Accounting in the Department of the State support for the operations of the Amistad 26 Treasury.¹ Commission shall be appropriated by the Legislature to the 27 28 commission through a separate line item in the annual 29 appropriations act. 30 The commission shall consist of [23] 22 members, including [the Secretary of State or a designee,] the Commissioner of 31 32 Education or a designee, who shall serve as a voting member, and the chair of the executive board of the Presidents' Council or a 33 34 designee, serving ex officio, two members of the Senate or their 35 designees, no more than one of whom shall be of the same political party, appointed by the President of the Senate to serve as [non-36 voting] voting members for the two-year legislative term during 37 38 which they are appointed, two members of the General Assembly or 39 their designees, no more than one of whom shall be of the same political party, appointed by the Speaker of the General Assembly 40 41 to serve as [non-voting] voting members for the two-year 42 legislative term during which they are appointed, and 16 public 43 members.

1 Public members , all of whom shall serve as voting members, 2 shall be appointed as follows: four public members, no more than 3 two of whom shall be of the same political party, shall be appointed 4 by the President of the Senate; four public members, no more than 5 two of whom shall be of the same political party, shall be appointed by the Speaker of the General Assembly; and eight public members, 6 7 no more than four of whom shall be of the same political party, 8 shall be appointed by the Governor. The public members shall be 9 residents of this State, chosen with due regard to broad geographic 10 representation and racial and ethnic diversity, who have an interest 11 in the history of the African slave trade and slavery in America and 12 the accomplishments, experiences, and contributions of African-13 Americans to our society.

14 b. Each public member of the commission shall serve for a 15 term of three years, except that of the initial members so appointed: 16 one member appointed by the President of the Senate, one member 17 appointed by the Speaker of the General Assembly, and two 18 members appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of one 19 year; one member appointed by the President of the Senate, one 20 member appointed by the Speaker of the General Assembly, and 21 three members appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of 22 two years; and two members appointed by the President of the 23 Senate, two members appointed by the Speaker of the General 24 Assembly, and three members appointed by the Governor shall 25 serve for terms of three years. Public members shall be eligible for 26 reappointment. They shall serve until their successors are appointed 27 and qualified, and the term of the successor of any incumbent shall 28 be calculated from the expiration of the term of that incumbent. A 29 vacancy occurring other than by expiration of term shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment but for the unexpired 30 31 term only.

32 c. The members of the commission shall serve without
33 compensation but shall be entitled to reimbursement for all
34 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

35 d. The [Secretary of State, or a designee, shall serve as the chair and the Commissioner of Education, or a designee, shall serve 36 37 as the vice-chair of the commission shall annually elect a 38 chairperson and a vice-chairperson from among its members. The 39 commission shall meet upon the call of the chairperson or of a 40 majority of the commission members. The presence of a majority 41 of the authorized voting membership of the commission shall be 42 required for the conduct of official business.

e. [The New Jersey Historical Commission shall serve as staff
for the Amistad Commission. The New Jersey Historical
Commission may, subject to the availability of appropriations, hire
additional staff and consultants to carry out the duties and
responsibilities of the Amistad Commission.] <u>The commission</u>
shall interview and appoint an executive director, who shall serve at

1 its pleasure and shall be a person qualified by training and 2 experience to perform the duties of the office. The commission 3 shall approve all Amistad personnel job descriptions and all persons 4 recommended for employment by its executive director. ¹[The 5 Department of Education shall provide any additional staff that the 6 Amistad Commission might deem necessary.]¹ 7 f. The [Department of Education] <u>Amistad Commission</u> shall: 8 (1) [assist the Amistad Commission in marketing and 9 distributing] market and distribute to educators, administrators and 10 school districts in the State educational information and other 11 materials on the African slave trade, slavery in America, the 12 vestiges of slavery in this country and the contributions of African-13 Americans to our society; 14 (2) conduct [at least one] teacher [workshop] workshops annually on the African slave trade, slavery in America, the vestiges 15 16 of slavery in this country and the accomplishments, experiences, 17 and contributions of African-Americans to our society, covering 18 information which often has been omitted from traditional 19 curricula; 20 (3) [assist the Amistad Commission in monitoring] monitor and 21 assess the inclusion of such materials and curricula in the State's 22 educational system; and 23 (4) [consult with the Amistad Commission to determine ways it 24 may] survey, catalog, and [extend] recommend to the State Board of Education the expansion of, content about slave trade [and], 25 American slavery education , and African-American history 26 27 presently being incorporated into the Core Curriculum Content 28 Standards] New Jersey Student Learning Standards and taught in 29 the State's educational system , the purpose of which is to ensure 30 that all New Jersey students acquire a broad and deep knowledge of 31 all people who contributed to the founding and development of New 32 Jersey and the United States and to promote the self-esteem, 33 confidence, and identity of students who previously may not have 34 learned about past and living examples of people of their own 35 cultural identity who have had positive impacts upon the American 36 story. 37 (cf: P.L.2004, c.94, s.1) 38 39 2. (New section) As used in P.L.2002, c.75 (C.52:16A-40 86 et seq.) and P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), "African American" means all people of African descent 41 42 in the United States. 43 3. (New section) The Legislature finds and declares that: 44 45 a. Since the days of slavery, public school curricula have consistently omitted or misrepresented the history of African 46 47 Americans.

b. To correct these omissions, all public schools in the State of
New Jersey should include instruction that infuses into all courses
on the United States, the centuries of contributions and
accomplishments by African Americans in the building and
development of America.

6 c. The Amistad Commission, created pursuant to P.L.2002, 7 c.75 (C.52:16A-86 et seq.), is responsible for designing and 8 promoting the implementation of education and awareness 9 programs in New Jersey concerned with slavery in America and the 10 contributions of African Americans, and for developing curriculum 11 guidelines for the teaching of this information. The Amistad 12 Commission is an ideal agency to recommend curricular materials to school districts. 13

15 4. (New section) a. Every board of education shall include, 16 in the curriculum of all elementary and secondary school students, 17 instruction that infuses into all courses on the United States, the 18 centuries of accomplishments by African Americans in the building 19 and development of America including, but not limited to, the areas 20 of industry, military, government, and the professions; local 21 communities; math, science, medicine, and space; architecture and 22 the arts; social institutions and culture; and other aspects of life in 23 America.

24 b. The instruction shall enable students to identify and analyze 25 applicable theories concerning human nature and behavior; to know 26 and understand the nation's heritage of slavery and freedom; to 27 know and understand the impact of African diasporic cultures and 28 institutions on the Americas; to know and understand the 29 contributions of African Americans to all areas of American society 30 throughout its history, beginning with the colonial period; to know 31 and understand that inequality is a consequence of prejudice and 32 discrimination in the pursuit of maintaining power and dominance 33 over certain portions of society; to know and understand citizenship 34 and disenfranchisement; and to understand that issues of moral 35 dilemma and conscience have a profound impact on the nation and the self-image and self-realization of its entire population, 36 37 especially the personal and civic development of students in grades 38 kindergarten through 12. The instruction shall also emphasize the 39 personal responsibility of each citizen to fight racism and hatred 40 whenever and wherever it happens and to uphold the national ideals 41 of freedom and justice for all.

c. The Department of Education shall work with the Amistad
Commission to ensure that all department assessment tools for New
Jersey schools are inclusive of the curricular requirements
established pursuant to this section.

47 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
