1 AN ACT concerning law enforcement officers and supplementing chapter 14 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes. 2 3 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 4 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary, every ¹<u>uniformed</u>¹ State, county, and municipal ¹<u>patrol</u>¹ law 8 enforcement officer shall wear a ¹body worn¹ camera that 9 electronically records audio and video while acting in the performance 10 of ¹[his] <u>the officer's</u>¹ official duties. 11 b. The ¹body worn¹ cameras required by subsection a. of this 12 section shall be funded by forfeiture funds collected pursuant to 13 N.J.S.2C:64-6, in an amount to be determined by the Attorney 14 General. 15 ¹c. For the purposes of this section, "body worn camera" means a 16 mobile video recording system worn by a law enforcement officer.¹ 17 18 19 2. The Attorney General is authorized to promulgate guidelines or directives, as appropriate, to implement and enforce the 20 21 provisions of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature 22 as this bill). 23 3. This act shall take effect ¹[on the first day of the sixth 24 month following] immediately, but shall remain inoperative until 25 the¹ enactment ¹into law of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before 26 the Legislature as Senate Bill No. 101 or Assembly Bill No. 4312 of 27 $(2020)^{1}$, but the Attorney General may take such administrative 28 29 action in advance as shall be necessary for the implementation of 30 the act.
